TO THE HON. ANTHONY KENNEDY, JUSTICE FOR THE ABOVE CIRCUIT:

Respondent, Lamy Brewster, requests a 30 day extension for filing her opposition to the Petition for Writ of Certiorari. This is Respondent's first request for an extension and is submitted more than 10 days before the opposition due date (presently January 10, 2018). If the request is granted, the opposition will be due Friday, February 9, 2018.
