I am new counsel of record for Respondents A.A. Nettles, Sr. Properties Limited and Eula Lambert Boyles in the above-captioned matter. The petition for a writ of certiorari in this case was filed on September 23, 2019. On October 11, 2019, the Court called for a response to the petition. On October 14, 2019, Respondents sought and were granted an extension of 30 days. With that extension, the response to the petition is currently due December 12, 2019.

Pursuant to Rule 30.4, Respondents respectfully request that the time for filing a response to the petition be extended by an additional 30 days. If the requested extension is granted, the response would be due on Monday, January 13 (January 12 is a Sunday).
