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To the Honorable Ketanji Brown Jackson, Associate Justice of the Supreme

Court of the United States and Circuit Justice for the First Circuit:

Applicant, Quinton Spinks, through counsel, respectfully requests that the time to file a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari in this matter be extended for sixty days up to and including August 21, 2023. The Court of Appeals issued its opinion and judgment

on March 23, 2023. Absent an extension of time, the petition would be due on or

before June 21, 2023. This Application is being filed at least ten days before the due date, in accordance with S.Ct.R. 13.5. This Court has jurisdiction under 28 U.S.C. §1254(1).

Reasons Justifying an Extension of Time

Counsel respectfully requests a 60-day extension of time because:

1. Following the First Circuit's opinion, counsel and petitioner conferred, and counsel was of the understanding that Applicant did not intend to seek certiorari.

2. Undersigned counsel expected to receive written confirmation of that decision, but Applicant did not provide it.

3. Undersigned counsel did not seek discharge from the First Circuit because he was waiting for the aforementioned confirmation.

4. Subsequently, Applicant suggested to undersigned counsel that he was reconsidering the decision whether to seek *certiorari*.

5. If Applicant does choose to file a petition, whether through undersigned counsel or *pro se*, the remaining three weeks on the present time to petition are not adequate to complete and file it, particularly if Applicant chooses to proceed *pro se*.

For the reasons expressed above, Quinton Spinks, through present counsel, respectfully requests that this Court grant him a 60-day extension to file a petition for a writ of certiorari up to and including August 21, 2023.
