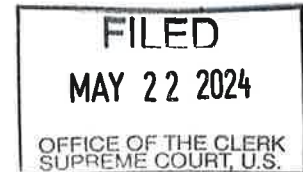

Re: Request for extension of time to file writ of certiorari.

I am the Petitioner in the case of *David Dunlap vs. JetBlue Airways Corp.* NY Court of Appeals Mo. No. 2023-707 [attached], NY AD No. 534443, NY WCB Case No. G2589047. I believe this is a matter that needs to be reviewed by the *Supreme Court of the United States* because of violations of due process and equal protections that would have broad implications beyond the State of New York. According to the *Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States*, a request for a writ of certiorari is required to be filed within 90 days of the lower court ruling, which is currently due by May 22, 2024. Due to financial constraints (aggravated by the very subject of our original petition to the New York WCB), and difficulty finding a properly qualified counsel that has experience with our somewhat complicated case, I would like to respectfully request an extension to file until, and including, July 1st, 2024. This is Petitioner's first request for an extension of time to file a writ of certiorari.

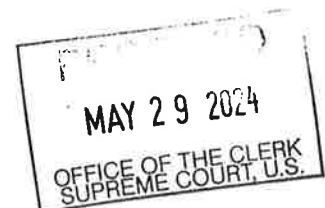
