

1 Q. Got it.

2 A. And, actually, some of the times --
3 some of the things seem to have been
4 duplicated. And it was probably when I did
5 that.

6 Q. When you say "some of the things
7 seem to have been duplicated," what do you mean
8 by that?

9 A. I mean that there seems to be the
10 same meeting twice successively.

11 Q. Can you point to any examples of
12 that on the page in front of you?

13 A. I would say, for example -- not on
14 the page in front of me, no, but I have seen it
15 in the document at one point. I don't remember
16 where it was. But what it was was that a
17 meeting began and ended, and where it began was
18 listed as a meeting and where it ended was
19 listed as the same meeting again. But it was
20 actually one meeting.

21 Q. Got it. So if we come across those,
22 you know, maybe we'll recognize those and we'll
23 try to call them out.

24 Going back to the text that we were
25 looking at a moment ago, it says, there again,

1 this is for February 5 at 2200 hours or
2 probably 1000 hours, interaction with civil
3 society organizations on UN topics.

4 Do you see that?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. What do you understand a civil
7 society organization to be?

8 A. Civil society encompasses all
9 dimensions of the international community
10 beyond the governmental, as far as I understand
11 it. It includes non-governmental
12 organizations, NGOs, academia, journalists,
13 cultural institutions and others.

14 Q. But they are organizations; is that
15 correct?

16 A. Civil society can be an individual
17 working in their capacity as, for example, a
18 scholar or a professor, or it can be an
19 organization. It can be individuals or
20 organizations.

21 Q. And when in time did you develop
22 your understanding of the meaning of the term
23 "civil society organization" that you just
24 described for me?

25 A. Early on in my work. That was my

1 understanding of civil society and what my
2 engagement with civil society would encompass.

3 Q. By the way, the private lunch, on
4 the third line of this page that I recognize
5 was later deleted, did that lunch -- did that
6 event occur at the building at 165 East -- or
7 115 East 65th Street?

8 A. No, it did not.

9 Q. Can you think of any example of any
10 human being or organization that would not fall
11 within the rubric of a civil society
12 organization?

13 MR. BERGER: Objection,
14 argumentative.

15 BY MR. SINAIKO:

16 Q. You may answer.

17 A. If it is related to my work at the
18 United Nations, if the individual or
19 organization is approaching me in connection
20 with my work as a representative of the State
21 of Palestine at the United Nations, then to me,
22 it is a legitimate civil society request. That
23 is how I see it.

24 If a student, for example, is doing
25 research on Palestine at the United Nations and

July 22, 2021

1 wants to understand about the history of the
2 Palestine question and the General Assembly and
3 approaches me, to me, that is a member of civil
4 society that I should be responsive to.

5 Q. So any person or organization who
6 approaches you to ask about, you know, a
7 subject related to your work as Deputy
8 Permanent Observer, that person or organization
9 falls within the category of civil society
10 organization; correct?

11 A. Correct. In my view, if they are --
12 obviously, they have to have some kind of
13 affiliation, a student with a university, a
14 professor, someone working with an
15 organization. It's not usually someone off the
16 street that would ask me about my work as the
17 Deputy Permanent Observer.

18 But if I was approached, either by a
19 phone call or a letter or an E-mail or in an
20 event, about my work at the UN, then I would
21 consider that to be a legitimate civil society
22 interaction.

23 Q. Going to the second part of this
24 text that we were looking at a moment ago, it
25 says, UN topics.

July 22, 2021

1 Do you see that?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. What do you understand UN topics to
4 mean?

5 A. Issues regarding Palestine at the
6 UN.

7 Q. Anything other than that?

8 A. I wouldn't be discussing anything
9 other than that. That is my expertise. That
10 is my purview.

11 Q. Okay. So to the extent that -- to
12 the extent that this document that we have
13 marked as Exhibit 5 references UN topics, it is
14 just this question of Palestine that you
15 referred to a moment ago; is that correct?

16 A. Yes, that is correct.

17 Q. To come back to a question I asked a
18 moment ago, which I'm not sure I got a complete
19 answer to, can you give me an example of
20 anybody that you would speak to, in your
21 capacity as Deputy Permanent Observer, who
22 would not fall within the category of civil
23 society organizations?

24 A. I cannot think of anyone that I
25 would speak to, in my capacity as the Deputy

July 22, 2021

1 Permanent Observer of the State of Palestine,
2 that would not fall into civil society, again,
3 if they had a formal affiliation with a school
4 or with an NGO or with an IGO or a humanitarian
5 or human rights organization.

6 MR. BERGER: Now that the
7 witness has finished answering the question,
8 may I ask for clarification, whether you mean
9 to put aside, Steve, those who are representing
10 other Member States of the United Nations?

11 MR. SINAIKO: Of course. I
12 mean, yeah, I thought that was implicit in the
13 question, but if you want, I can ask the
14 question again with that qualifier in it.

15 BY MR. SINAIKO:

16 Q. Maybe it would be better if I just
17 asked Ambassador Abdelhady-Nasser whether she
18 understood that to be excluded from my
19 question.

20 A. Yes, I did.

21 MR. SINAIKO: Let's mark as
22 our next exhibit, I think this will be Exhibit
23 6, a document that is at Tab 17 A in our book.

24 (Deposition Exhibit No. 6 was
25 marked for identification.)

July 22, 2021

1 BY MR. SINAIKO:

2 Q. Ambassador Abdelhady-Nasser, I would
3 ask you whether you have seen this document
4 before today?

5 A. Yes, I have.

6 Q. Do you recognize this document?

7 A. Yes, I do.

8 Q. And when was the first time you saw
9 this document?

10 A. I guess about two weeks ago.

11 Q. Two weeks ago. And do you tie that
12 document to your initial meeting with
13 Mr. Berger about two weeks ago?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And what do you recognize this
16 document to be?

17 A. This is my calendar of engagements,
18 work assignments, as reflected in the grid.

19 Q. Let me ask the question a little
20 differently. Do you understand Exhibit 7 -- I
21 guess we're on Exhibit 6, do you understand
22 that to be a different version of Exhibit 5
23 that we were looking at a moment ago?

24 A. I believe it's the same thing, only
25 it identifies who I was meeting with.

July 22, 2021

1 Q. And do you know -- do you know when
2 in time that document was prepared?

3 A. I don't know the exact timeline.

4 Q. Okay. Did you have a role in
5 preparing the document that has been marked as
6 Exhibit 6 and is on the screen in front of you
7 now?

8 A. I gave them my calendar.

9 Q. Apart from that, did you have any
10 role in preparing this document?

11 A. I did not type this document, no.

12 Q. Did you provide any of the
13 descriptive information, apart from delivering
14 your -- withdrawn. Let me put the question
15 again.

16 Apart from supplying your -- the
17 Excel spreadsheet, into which you had
18 downloaded your Google calendar, to your
19 lawyers, did you have any role in preparing the
20 text that's in the subject column of this
21 document?

22 A. The text reflects what I sent to my
23 lawyers; the name of the diplomat that I met
24 with, the person that I met with.

25 Q. Did you review this document before

July 22, 2021

1 it was delivered to the Plaintiff?

2 A. Yes, I did.

3 Q. And did you find any inaccuracies in
4 it when you reviewed the document?

5 A. No, I did not.

6 Q. All right. I would like you to
7 focus for a moment on the first line of the
8 first page of this document. You see there it
9 says, internal Palestine UN Mission business?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Was that text in the calendar that
12 you supplied to Mr. Berger and his colleague?

13 A. No.

14 Q. And do you know whether this
15 reflects an event?

16 A. It would reflect either a staff
17 meeting or some other interaction with my
18 colleagues at the Mission.

19 Q. And do you know where the event took
20 place?

21 A. At the Mission.

22 Q. Do you know who was in attendance at
23 this meeting?

24 A. It would be my colleagues at the
25 staff. It was the beginning of the year, so

July 22, 2021

1 everyone would have returned from holidays,
2 from the New Year, and it was probably the
3 staff meeting to launch the year.

4 Q. And what -- do you know -- can you
5 tell me what topics were discussed during this
6 meeting?

7 MR. BERGER: Objection,
8 instruct the witness not to answer on the basis
9 of functional immunity.

10 BY MR. SINAIKO:

11 Q. And Dr. Abdelhady-Nasser, are you
12 going to follow your counsel's instruction?

13 A. Yes, I am.

14 Q. One last question about that first
15 entry. Was there anybody at this meeting that
16 is described in the first line of Exhibit 6 --
17 it was a meeting; is that correct?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Was anybody other than Observer
20 Mission staff in attendance at that meeting?

21 A. No.

22 Q. Go to the next line. It says,
23 personal note about UN Mission business?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. Does this reflect that there was a

July 22, 2021

1 personal note in your calendar?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And under what circumstances would
4 you put a personal note in your calendar?

5 A. I often put in reminders to myself
6 about readings that I have to do or documents
7 that I have to prepare, if it's a speech I need
8 to write or a memorandum, I remind myself to
9 answer E-mails or to follow up on various
10 issues.

11 So the personal notes in my calendar
12 are usually about tasks that I am individually
13 responsible for or taking care of or need to
14 follow up on.

15 Q. And without telling me the subject
16 of the task, can you tell me the type of task
17 that is reflected by this entry, the second
18 line on Exhibit 6?

19 A. It would be any number of those
20 things. It could be, again, a letter that I
21 was writing or a report that I was finishing,
22 because the year had concluded and we would
23 have to do reports to reflect on the previous
24 year.

25 Q. Right. I guess my question is, as

July 22, 2021

1 the person whose calendar is reflected here,
2 can you tell me what type of -- you know,
3 again, without telling me what the topic was,
4 because I know Mr. Berger will object to that,
5 and maybe I'll ask, maybe I won't, but for the
6 moment, can you tell me the type of personal
7 note that this was?

8 A. I believe I was writing a
9 recommendation letter.

10 Q. And this recommendation letter was,
11 in some fashion, related to the business of the
12 Observer Mission?

13 A. Yes, it was. It was about an
14 intern.

15 Q. All right. Go to an entry that's on
16 the first page here, February, and I'm just
17 going to give you the timestamp that's on the
18 document, although I recognize that the
19 timestamps are probably not accurate, but it's
20 a good way for us to work our way through.

21 I am looking at an entry that says,
22 February 5, 2020 at 2200. Do you see that one?

23 A. Yes, I do.

24 Q. And that says, interaction with
25 civil society organization, Professor Grob, on

July 22, 2021

1 UN topic; do you see that?

2 A. Yes, I do.

3 Q. What does that entry reflect?

4 A. It reflects a meeting that I had
5 with Professor Grob, who is a civil society
6 individual. He is not an organization. He is
7 a professor affiliated with Fairleigh Dickinson
8 University who often reaches out to me to
9 discuss the trajectory of the Palestine
10 question at the UN and to propose ideas and
11 initiatives to consider undertaking at the UN.

12 Q. Professor Grob, that's Leonard Grob;
13 correct?

14 A. Correct.

15 Q. Okay. And how is it that you
16 conclude that he is appropriately classed as a
17 civil society organization?

18 A. Because Professor Grob is a
19 professor. He works in an academic
20 institution. And --

21 Q. So if --

22 A. -- he partners with another
23 professor and they often deal with
24 Israel/Palestine. But their focus has often --
25 has been in their engagements with me on the UN

July 22, 2021

1 angle and how to engage the UN angle for
2 Israeli/Palestinian peace.

3 Q. And would it be fair to say that you
4 regard Professor Grob as a civil society
5 organization on account of his interest in
6 issues related to the UN and Palestine?

7 MR. BERGER: I'm going to
8 object to the form of the question. You have
9 twice misstated, after she told you she doesn't
10 regard him as an organization but as an
11 individual.

12 If you want to ask the question, go
13 right ahead.

14 MR. SINAIKO: I'm just reading
15 from your document, but the witness can answer
16 the question and I would ask the court reporter
17 to repeat it first.

18 (Reporter read back previous
19 question.)

20 THE WITNESS: I regard
21 Professor Grob as an active individual in civil
22 society based on his interest and work on
23 Israel/Palestine.

24 BY MR. SINAIKO:

25 Q. Professor Grob doesn't have any

July 22, 2021

1 direct connection to the United Nations so far
2 as you know; correct?

3 A. I know that Professor Grob meets
4 with a lot of UN diplomats, including from
5 other countries, but, specifically, P5
6 countries, permanent members of the Security
7 Council and other Arab countries in the Middle
8 East, particularly Egypt, Jordan and others.

9 Q. He doesn't hold any title with the
10 United Nations; correct?

11 A. Fairleigh Dickinson University has a
12 relationship with the United Nations, as do
13 other universities.

14 Q. Professor Grob, he doesn't have any
15 title with the United Nations; does he?

16 A. No, he does not.

17 Q. He is not an employee of the United
18 Nations; is he?

19 A. No, he is not.

20 Q. He doesn't have any other formal
21 connection to the United Nations of which you
22 are aware; correct?

23 A. I am not aware of any other formal
24 connection to the United Nations.

25 Q. I would direct your attention,

July 22, 2021

1 Ambassador Abdelhady-Nasser, to the third line.

2 A. Uh-huh.

3 Q. Do you see there it says,
4 interaction with Rana Hajjaj of civil society
5 organization Al-Quds Bard College, on UN topic?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. What is Al-Quds Bard College?

8 A. Bard College is an academic
9 institution here in New York and they have a
10 branch of the college in Jerusalem called
11 Al-Quds Bard College.

12 Q. Is that affiliated with Al-Quds
13 University?

14 A. No. I believe they are separate.

15 Q. And who is Rana Hajjaj?

16 A. She is a director at Bard College
17 that oversees partnerships for Al-Quds Bard
18 College.

19 Q. And how does Al-Quds Bard College
20 qualify as a civil society organization?

21 A. It is a university.

22 Q. So all universities, in your view,
23 qualify as civil society organizations?

24 A. They are part of the civil society
25 environment or scope, this huge sphere of civil

July 22, 2021

1 society that, again, from my understanding,
2 includes academia, academia in toto, in its
3 entirety, university professors, students,
4 cultural centers, global centers in a
5 university, for example.

6 Q. In your view, would it be fair to
7 say that any university -- I'm sorry. There
8 was an echo in the line. I will put the
9 question again.

10 Would it be fair to say that, in
11 your view, any university, college or other
12 academic institution qualifies as a civil
13 society organization?

14 A. That is my understanding.

15 Q. And what was the nature of the event
16 that is reflected on this line on Exhibit 6?

17 A. The one with Rana Hajjaj?

18 Q. Correct.

19 A. She had asked me to discuss -- well,
20 she was presenting her program and seeking
21 possible partnerships through the UN Global
22 Education Initiative.

23 Q. What is her program?

24 A. She supervises the Al-Quds Bard
25 College program which offers academic courses

July 22, 2021

1 to Palestinian students in the West Bank.

2 Q. What type of partnership was she
3 seeking?

4 A. With UN institutions. The UN
5 Division For Palestinian Rights partners with
6 certain colleges and universities for capacity
7 building, for training, for other things, and,
8 often, academics and others participate in
9 events that are organized by the Committee on
10 the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of
11 Palestinian People, and the UN Division For
12 Palestine Rights is a secretary arm of that
13 committee, so she was seeking an introduction.

14 Q. She was seeking an introduction.
15 Was she seeking to form a partnership with the
16 Observer Mission?

17 A. No. Because we do not partner -- we
18 cannot partner with universities.

19 Q. Why is that?

20 A. Because our work is focused on the
21 UN as diplomats. We don't enter into
22 partnerships with universities or other civil
23 society organizations. But often, civil
24 society individuals will contact us to, if they
25 are interested in working on Palestine or

July 22, 2021

1 Israel/Palestine as sort of an entry point to
2 the UN on this issue.

3 Q. Let's go down to the line that's at
4 February 20, 2020 at 1730 hours. Do you see
5 that one?

6 A. 1730?

7 Q. Yes, ma'am.

8 A. South Africa?

9 Q. That's right. Can you explain to me
10 what the event was that's reflected there?

11 A. That was the meeting with the
12 political coordinator of the Permanent Mission
13 of South Africa to the United Nations.

14 Q. Understood. And who were the
15 participants in that event?

16 A. It was myself and the political
17 coordinator.

18 Q. Where did that event take place?

19 A. At the United Nations.

20 Q. Let's go down to the very -- the
21 very next entry. It says, interactions with
22 CEIRPP bureau meeting. Can you tell me what
23 that event was?

24 A. The CEIRPP is the UN Committee on
25 the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the

July 22, 2021

1 Palestinian People. There is a small bureau
2 composed of various countries chaired by
3 Senegal. Palestine is a part of that bureau,
4 so that was a meeting of the bureau of that
5 committee.

6 Q. And why is this meeting -- why is
7 this meeting on this list as opposed to the
8 main calendar that we looked at a few minutes
9 ago, if you know?

10 A. I don't know.

11 Q. Did you have any input into
12 determining which entries from your calendar
13 would be placed on this list versus which
14 entries would be placed on the main calendar
15 that we looked at a few minutes ago?

16 A. I think that, in general, closed
17 meetings that were not public meetings on UN
18 premises in the General Assembly or in the
19 Security Council or in one of the committees
20 were placed on this list. And so the bureau
21 meeting would be a closed meeting.

22 There wouldn't be anybody in
23 attendance, except the Ambassadors or Deputy
24 Ambassadors of the bureau, which is just a few
25 handful of countries, and those bureau meetings

July 22, 2021

1 are not a matter of public record.

2 Q. Go down to the entry that's on
3 February 28, 2020 at 1600. Do you see that
4 one?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. That one says, interaction with
7 civil society organization Fairleigh Dickinson
8 University on UN topics. Do you see that?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. Was that a meeting that was attended
11 by anyone affiliated with the UN, other than
12 yourself?

13 A. No, just myself.

14 Q. And I think -- can you tell us what
15 the nature was of the event that's reflected in
16 this on entry on the calendar?

17 A. It was a meeting with the global
18 education department at Fairleigh Dickinson
19 University, and it was about their Model UN
20 program.

21 Q. What aspects of their Model UN
22 program did this meeting concern?

23 A. About the possibility of my speaking
24 to the Model UN program on Palestine's work at
25 the UN.

July 22, 2021

1 Q. And did you, in fact, ever do that?

2 A. No, I did not, because the pandemic
3 happened. So I met with them, introductions
4 were made, and then two weeks later, everything
5 came to a full stop.

6 Q. Understood. And when you say --
7 when you say UN topics in this entry, you're
8 talking about -- you're talking about the
9 request that you appear and speak to or
10 participate in the Model United Nations at
11 Fairleigh Dickinson University?

12 A. Yes. It included the request for me
13 to speak at the Model UN and also discussion
14 about the status of the Palestine question at
15 the UN, because it was the director of the
16 Global Education and Affairs Department.

17 Q. Where did this event take place?

18 A. At Fairleigh Dickinson University.

19 Q. This was an in-person meeting?

20 A. Yes, it was.

21 Q. And apart from the representative of
22 Fairleigh Dickinson and yourself, was anybody
23 else in attendance?

24 A. No.

25 Q. Was Professor Grob at the meeting?

July 22, 2021

1 A. No, he was not. But I did mention
2 that I knew Professor Grob. I thought it was a
3 very small world.

4 Q. Let's move a few more pages into the
5 document and go to the entry on September 22,
6 2020 at 1700. Let me know, Ambassador
7 Abdelhady-Nasser, when you have that line in
8 front of you.

9 A. I see it.

10 Q. And you see that it says,
11 interaction with Arab Group and Judge Emmanuel
12 -- I'm going to get this wrong -- Ugirashebuja?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. So can you tell me what this -- can
15 you tell me what this entry reflects?

16 A. It was a meeting of the Arab Group
17 at the UN, and it was a request by Judge
18 Emmanuel to present his candidacy to the Arab
19 group.

20 So when certain judges or diplomats
21 or others are seeking appointments or election
22 at the UN, they lobby groups. They lobby the
23 Arab group, they lobby the African group, they
24 lobby the eastern European group.

25 And so I was in attendance in this

July 22, 2021

1 Arab Group meeting and he came to present his
2 candidacy.

3 Q. And what is the Arab Group? Sorry
4 for not knowing. What is the Arab Group?

5 A. The Arab Group is the constellation
6 of 22 Arab countries, including the State of
7 Palestine. It is currently 21 because Syria is
8 suspended from the Arab Group at the moment.

9 Q. So what was Judge Emmanuel looking
10 to be appointed or elected?

11 A. I don't actually recall if it was
12 for the ICJ or the -- I believe it was for the
13 ICJ, but I'm not sure, actually.

14 Q. And by ICJ, you mean the
15 International Court of Justice?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. Let's go back to March 9, 2020, at
18 14:00. Okay. This is the third line up from
19 the bottom of the page. Do you see that,
20 Ambassador?

21 A. Yes, I do.

22 Q. And do you see it says, interaction
23 with civil society organization, Palestine
24 Institute for Public Diplomacy on UN topics?

25 A. Yes, I do.

July 22, 2021

1 Q. And what is the Palestine Institute
2 for Public Diplomacy?

3 A. It is a non-governmental
4 organization based in Ramallah.

5 Q. It is not part of the United
6 Nations; correct?

7 A. No, it is not.

8 Q. And was this -- I guess we're
9 getting right up to the line here. Was this an
10 in-person event or was this a virtual event of
11 some sort?

12 A. It was a phone call.

13 Q. And who were the participants in the
14 phone call?

15 A. Myself and someone from the PIPD.

16 Q. Okay. And when you say this was a
17 -- when you say that this is an event that
18 concerned UN topics, what do you mean?

19 A. The individual from the PIPD was
20 calling to ask me about initiatives that we
21 would be undertaking at the UN in the coming
22 year, including the annual exhibit at the
23 United Nations on the International Day of
24 Solidarity with the Palestinian people.

25 Q. Okay. Let's go to March 17, 2020 at

July 22, 2021

1 1900. The first one on this page, actually.

2 Do you see that one, Ambassador

3 Abdelhady-Nasser?

4 A. I see it.

5 Q. Who is Michael Lynk?

6 A. Michael Lynk is the UN Special
7 Rapporteur on the human rights situation in the
8 occupied Palestinian territory.

9 Q. And Ardi Imseis?

10 A. Ardi Imseis is a professor and a
11 lawyer based in Canada. He liaises with the UN
12 Division For Palestinian Rights on legal
13 issues. He is often presented at the seminars
14 and he is also part of the Commission of
15 Inquiry of the United Nations on Yemen.

16 Q. And a -- does Professor Imseis have
17 any formal role at the United Nations
18 currently?

19 A. Yes, he does. He is part of the UN
20 Commission of Inquiry on Yemen. It's a high
21 level panel of experts.

22 Q. Where did this event take place?

23 A. On the phone.

24 Q. And where were you when you took
25 this phone call?

July 22, 2021

1 A. At home.

2 Q. Going down two lines, on March 17,
3 at 1800.

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. It says, interaction with civil
6 society organization Professor Boon on UN
7 topics. Do you see that?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. What was the nature of this event?

10 A. Professor Boon was a professor at
11 Seton Hall University that had E-mailed me to
12 request to speak with her students at Seton
13 Hall Law School about Security Council
14 resolutions on Palestine, and that was a phone
15 call that we had. In light of the lockdown,
16 she wanted to figure out how we could still
17 have that interaction with her students.

18 Q. Did the interaction with Professor
19 Boon's students ever occur?

20 A. Yes, it did.

21 Q. When was that?

22 A. That occurred at the end of March.

23 Q. And is that on your calendar here?

24 A. Yes, it is.

25 Q. Which entry is that on your

July 22, 2021

1 calendar?

2 A. It's March 30, 2020.

3 Q. At 1600?

4 A. Yes, correct.

5 Q. So during this -- this entry here,
6 interaction with civil society org -- oh, I
7 see. I'm so sorry. Now I see it. That was
8 actually the next thing on my list, in any
9 event.

10 So interaction with civil society
11 organization Seton Hall on UN topics, that
12 entry, am I correct, reflects your conversation
13 with Professor Boon's students?

14 A. Yes, correct.

15 Q. And what were the topics that you
16 discussed with Professor Boon's students?

17 A. The focus was on Security Council
18 resolutions, particularly Security Council
19 Resolution 2334 of 2016, and the Palestine
20 question, in general, at the UN.

21 Q. Where were you physically located
22 during this interaction with civil society
23 organization Seton Hall on UN topics, that took
24 place on March 30th at 1600?

25 A. I was at home.

July 22, 2021

1 Q. And what was the purpose of your
2 conversation with Professor Boon's students on
3 March 30, 2000?

4 MR. BERGER: Objection, asked
5 and answered, but you may answer again.

6 THE WITNESS: I was responding
7 to a request by Professor Boon to speak to her
8 students on the specific topic, based on my
9 expertise as an Ambassador and a Deputy
10 Permanent Observer of the State of Palestine to
11 the United Nations.

12 Often professors seek that kind of
13 input, that kind of expertise to be shared with
14 their students, to give them a sense of real
15 life diplomacy or even some background
16 information that they wouldn't otherwise have
17 been able to read in the newspaper or some
18 other coverage of events at the UN.

19 BY MR. SINAIKO:

20 Q. Would it be fair to say that you
21 participated in that event in your capacity as
22 Deputy Permanent Observer?

23 A. Yes. Absolutely.

24 Q. And would it be fair to say that
25 during that -- well, withdrawn.

July 22, 2021

1 Would it be fair to say that one of
2 the purposes of your discussion with Professor
3 Boon's students or your presentation to
4 Professor Boon's students was to put forward
5 the Palestinian view?

6 A. Yes. Everything that I do, in my
7 capacity as the Ambassador Deputy Permanent
8 Observer of the State of Palestine, I represent
9 the perspective, the view, the cause of the
10 Palestinian people.

11 Q. Would it be fair to say that during
12 the conversation you had or the presentation
13 you made to Professor Boon's students at Seton
14 Hall, that you were advocating for the cause of
15 the Palestinian people to Professor Boon's
16 students?

17 MR. BERGER: Objection to the
18 form of the question. Asked and answered and
19 argumentative. But you may answer again.

20 MR. SINAIKO: Could the court
21 reporter read the question back for the
22 witness, please?

23 (Reporter read back from the
24 record.)

25 THE WITNESS: When I speak at

July 22, 2021

1 the United Nations or with any civil society
2 organization, I speak in support of the rights
3 of the Palestinian people as per international
4 law, including humanitarian and human rights
5 law.

6 I do so within the framework of
7 international law and of UN resolutions
8 because, despite the fact that I have been
9 doing this now for 29 years to no avail, I
10 still believe that international law and UN
11 resolutions are the way to the realization of
12 the inalienable rights of the Palestinian
13 people.

14 So when I speak, again, at the UN or
15 with any civil society organization, I do so
16 with conviction that this is the path to
17 justice and peace.

18 BY MR. SINAIKO:

19 Q. And your purpose in speaking to
20 Professor Boon's students was to persuade them
21 of your point of view; correct?

22 A. No, it was not. It was to present a
23 reflection of my work at the UN on behalf of
24 the State of Palestine and the Palestinian
25 people, to give them an understanding of what

July 22, 2021

1 we do and why we do it, why do we seek General
2 Assembly resolutions on the Palestine question,
3 why do we engage at the Security Council. In
4 specific, Professor Boon asked me to address
5 the Security Council dimension of the Palestine
6 question at the UN.

7 So it was to explain how we engage
8 as diplomats and why we engage in the UN
9 context.

10 Q. By the way, this event or -- this
11 event that's covered by the entry on your
12 calendar that we're looking at now, this March
13 30, 1600 event, do you know whether this event
14 was open to anybody other than Professor Boon's
15 students?

16 In other words -- let me leave the
17 question as is. Do you know whether the event
18 was open to anybody other than the students in
19 Professor Boon's class?

20 A. I was told by Professor Boon that it
21 was only herself and her students, and that
22 those that are represented on the screen were
23 all of her students in that specific --

24 Q. So it was done by Zoom, is that
25 right, or something equivalent to the Zoom?

July 22, 2021

1 A. I think it was MS Teams. To be
2 quite honest, I mean, I couldn't even get my
3 picture up. So I had my -- it was like my
4 initials. It was the beginning of using all of
5 this technology.

6 Q. Right. I appreciate that.

7 A. Yeah.

8 Q. Okay. Let's go down to May 11, 2020
9 at 2030 hours.

10 A. Uh-huh.

11 Q. It says, interaction with civil
12 society organization, Professors Grob and
13 Segal, on UN topics?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. I think you had mentioned before
16 that Professor Segal had a cohort who sometimes
17 engages in, you know, in these issues with him?

18 A. Yes. Professor Grob's partner is
19 Professor Segal. They are like a team.

20 Q. So Professor Grob, in this entry, is
21 the same guy we talked about before at
22 Fairleigh Dickinson University; correct?

23 A. Correct.

24 Q. And who is Professor Segal, by the
25 way?

July 22, 2021

1 A. Professor Jerome Segal.

2 Q. Well, Professor Grob, I think we
3 have been introduced to, but Professor Segal,
4 where does he teach?

5 A. I don't actually know his university
6 affiliation. I know that he is an author, he
7 writes columns. I believe he is somewhere in
8 Baltimore.

9 Q. Is he a professor at all?

10 A. He signs his E-mails Professor
11 Jerome Segal, so I am assuming it's legitimate.

12 Q. He calls himself Professor?

13 A. He is, I am assuming he is a
14 professor because he calls himself Professor
15 Segal.

16 Q. Understood. Okay. And you regard
17 Professor Segal as a civil society
18 organization?

19 A. Yes, I do.

20 Q. On account of his interests in these
21 Palestine issues that are -- that you also work
22 on before the United Nations?

23 A. Yes, correct. He often, as I said,
24 writes columns and journalistic pieces on
25 Palestine at the UN. I know that he is an

July 22, 2021

1 author of certain books, or he is currently
2 authoring a book.

3 Q. And do you recall the nature of this
4 interaction that's reflected on this calendar
5 at May 11 at 2030 hours?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. What was the nature of it?

8 A. Professors Grob and Segal were
9 presenting an idea to me that would be launched
10 in the UN General Assembly.

11 Q. Go to June 22, 2020 and,
12 specifically, 1900 hours.

13 A. Uh-huh.

14 Q. There is an entry there that says,
15 interaction with Anita at division?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Can you tell me the nature of that
18 event, the event that is reflected in that
19 calendar entry?

20 A. It was a phone call with Anita
21 Mathur, who was the secretary of the UN
22 Division For Palestinian Rights. It was a
23 farewell phone call.

24 Q. So Anita is or was, at the time, a
25 departing official at the United Nations?

July 22, 2021

1 A. Correct. Well, she was leaving the
2 UN Division For Palestinian Rights to go to
3 another UN department.

4 Q. Understood. Okay. Let's go to the
5 bottom of the page, third line up from the
6 bottom, interaction with Michael O'Toole of
7 Ireland. Do you see that one?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Who is Michael O'Toole?

10 A. Michael O'Toole was with the UN
11 Mission of Ireland, Permanent Mission of
12 Ireland to the United Nations.

13 Q. And what was the nature of this
14 event?

15 A. Michael was a first secretary. He
16 had the -- among his files that he was
17 responsible for was Palestine/Israel, and this
18 was a farewell lunch.

19 Q. That's obviously not in person at
20 that time; right?

21 (Discussion held off the
22 record.)

23 THE COURT REPORTER: Excuse
24 me. You both cut out and I didn't hear after
25 "that is obviously not in person at that time."

July 22, 2021

1 MR. SINAIKO: I can repeat
2 that for you, Karen. I said, obviously, at
3 that time, it was not an in-person event, and
4 then Ambassador Abdelhady-Nasser responded, but
5 I don't want to repeat her response. I'll just
6 let her give it again.

7 THE WITNESS: I said that it
8 was an in-person event because it was outdoors
9 in July.

10 BY MR. SINAIKO:

11 Q. Go to the very next entry. It says,
12 interaction on UN topics for Indonesia Ph.D.
13 dissertation.

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Can you tell us what event is
16 reflected in that entry?

17 A. This was a discussion with a
18 student, an Indonesian student, who was the
19 daughter of an Indonesian diplomat to the UN,
20 who was doing research on Palestine.

21 Q. And this person, this daughter was
22 not herself affiliated with the UN in any way;
23 correct?

24 A. No, she was not. She was doing her
25 dissertation, and her parent, who was a

July 22, 2021

1 diplomat, connected her with me to discuss
2 Palestine at the UN.

3 Q. And what topics did you discuss with
4 her around Palestine and the UN?

5 A. We discussed everything from UN
6 General Assembly Resolution 181 all the way to
7 the present day.

8 Q. And you have had those conversations
9 in your official capacity as Deputy Permanent
10 Observer?

11 A. Yes, I did. She was tapping into my
12 expertise.

13 Q. And was one of your purposes in
14 having that conversation to advocate for the
15 cause of the Palestinian people?

16 A. That one, no, because I was simply
17 answering her questions as to Palestine at the
18 UN. So she asked me the questions, and I would
19 answer. And it was strictly about her
20 research.

21 Q. And do you remember the name of this
22 student?

23 A. I do not.

24 Q. Would you put the name of the
25 student in your calendar?

July 22, 2021

1 A. I don't actually recall. I don't
2 think so. I think it was an extremely long
3 name, and the reminder to myself in the
4 calendar was just to remind myself that I was
5 speaking with the Ph.D. student.

6 Q. Understood. Did anybody participate
7 in this conversation other than you and the
8 student?

9 A. No. It was just myself and the
10 student. And it was a phone call on WhatsApp.

11 Q. Would it be fair to say that you
12 regard any discussion of your work at the
13 Observer Mission as involving a UN topic?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Would it be fair to say that you
16 regard any conversation relating to the
17 question of Palestine, as you put it, as
18 involving a UN topic?

19 A. Yes. Every dimension of the
20 Palestine question is covered at the UN. It
21 is, actually, and this is something that is
22 often noted by UN diplomats, the
23 longest-standing agenda item at the United
24 Nations.

25 Q. Let's go to August 3, 1500. Do you

July 22, 2021

1 see that one is in the middle of the page?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Do you see that that says,
4 interaction with Brian Flynn of Ireland?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. What does that entry reflect, what
7 events does that entry reflect?

8 A. Brian Flynn is the Deputy Permanent
9 Representative of the Irish Mission to the UN.

10 Q. And what does this calendar entry
11 reflect?

12 A. It was a virtual meeting that we had
13 following Ireland's election to the Security
14 Council.

15 Q. Got it. And let's go to the very
16 next line. You see it says, interaction with
17 Ileana of Romania?

18 A. Uh-huh.

19 Q. What does that entry reflect?

20 A. Ileana is the Deputy Permanent
21 Representative of Romania to the UN, and that
22 was a lunch.

23 Q. Is Ileana her first or last name?

24 A. It is her first name.

25 Q. Go to April -- I'm sorry, August 5th

July 22, 2021

1 at 1700, same page.

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. It says, interaction with Georg of
4 Liechtenstein?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. What does that entry reflect?

7 A. Georg is the Deputy Permanent
8 Representative of Liechtenstein to the UN.

9 Q. And what does the entry reflect,
10 what sort of event?

11 A. It was a phone call from Georg to
12 myself about work at the UN General Assembly.
13 There was a draft resolution that Liechtenstein
14 was seeking support for.

15 Q. Let's go to September 16th at 2000
16 hours.

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Here it says, interaction with civil
19 society organization Greg Khalil on UN topics.
20 Do you see that?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Tell me what that entry reflects.

23 A. That reflects a phone call with Greg
24 Khalil, who is a former colleague who is now
25 teaching a course at Columbia University and is

July 22, 2021

1 a co-founder of the Telos Group.

2 Q. And what is -- you say that Greg
3 Khalil was a former colleague. What do you
4 mean by that?

5 A. He used to work for the NSU, the
6 Negotiation Support Unit, of the PLO.

7 Q. Got it. And you regard -- you
8 regard him -- well, withdrawn.

9 When you say "the PLO," you mean the
10 Palestine Liberation Organization, one of the
11 Defendants in this case; correct?

12 A. Correct.

13 Q. And what is this unit that he worked
14 with at the Palestine Liberation Organization?

15 A. Many years ago he worked for the
16 Negotiation Support Unit, and in 2004, when we
17 went to the International Court of Justice,
18 that is when I met Greg and we became friends.

19 Q. What is the Negotiation Support Unit
20 or what was it?

21 A. It was a unit that provided
22 technical support on negotiations to the
23 Palestinian leadership. It's based in
24 Ramallah.

25 Q. And Mr. Khalil now teaches at

July 22, 2021

1 Columbia, I think you said?

2 A. He teaches one course at Columbia,
3 but his main work is with the Telos Group.

4 Q. What is the Telos Group?

5 A. It is a faith-based organization
6 that seeks to promote reconciliation between
7 Palestinians and Israelis using faith as a
8 source of good, not confrontation.

9 Q. And this event that's reflected in
10 this line on your calendar, interaction with
11 civil society organization Greg Khalil on UN
12 topics, can you tell me what this -- what this
13 event concerned?

14 A. It was a phone call between Greg and
15 myself. We were, basically, catching up. And
16 he was telling me about his work and I was
17 telling him about my work at the UN. And he
18 actually commented that I was running around in
19 circles because what I told him we were doing
20 at the UN was the same thing I said ten years
21 ago.

22 Q. And how does Mr. Khalil qualify as a
23 civil society organization?

24 A. He is the co-founder of Telos, which
25 is a faith-based organization that engages in

July 22, 2021

1 civil society work to promote reconciliation
2 and peacemaking.

3 Q. Let's go to October 19, 2020, at
4 1930. And I think this is the fourth line down
5 on the page. Do you see that, Ambassador
6 Abdelhady-Nasser?

7 A. Yes, I do.

8 Q. You see that it says, interaction
9 with civil society organization NRC on UN
10 topics?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. What is NRC?

13 A. The Norwegian Refugee Council.

14 Q. What does this entry in your
15 calendar reflect?

16 A. It was a phone call with Itay
17 Epshtain of the Norwegian Refugee Council, and
18 he was discussing a report that the NRC had
19 recently presented to the UN.

20 Q. What was that report?

21 A. It was about the humanitarian
22 situation in the occupied Palestinian
23 territory.

24 Q. Right. And what is the, to the
25 extent you know, the purpose of this Norwegian

July 22, 2021

1 refugee committee?

2 A. The Norwegian Refugee Council
3 provides humanitarian support in many countries
4 around the world, including in Palestine, and
5 Itay was, I guess you could say, doing outreach
6 prior to the convening of the Fourth Committee
7 of the UN General Assembly, to which these
8 reports are very relevant because two of the
9 agenda items in the Fourth Committee concern
10 Palestine, and, particularly, the UNRWA agenda
11 item, U-N-R-W-A, which is the UN agency
12 responsible for Palestine refugees, and NRC
13 engages with UNRWA.

14 Q. Let's go to a couple of lines down
15 the page, October 27th at 1400?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Ambassador Abdelhady-Nasser, do you
18 see that it says there, interaction with Greta,
19 UNRWA rep?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Who is Greta?

22 A. Greta Gunnarsdottir is the UNRWA
23 representative here in New York to the UN.

24 Q. She is an official at the United
25 Nations?

July 22, 2021

1 A. She is an official of the United
2 Nations. She represents the United Nations
3 Relief and Works Agency for Palestine refugees.

4 Q. Let's go to November 3, 2020 at
5 1500. Do you see that one? It says, internal
6 Palestine UN Mission business?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. Do you know what that entry
9 reflects?

10 A. It reflected a meeting with one of
11 my colleagues in preparation for draft
12 resolutions that we were submitting to the
13 General Assembly, in specific, to the Fourth
14 Committee.

15 Q. Can we, for one moment, go back? I
16 think this is Exhibit 6. Can we go back to
17 Exhibit 5 for a moment?

18 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Would you
19 like to go off the record, Mr. Sinaiko?

20 MR. SINAIKO: No need. I
21 think we can get back to that exhibit quickly.
22 And if we could just go to the same date,
23 November 3 at 1500.

24 BY MR. SINAIKO:

25 Q. Do you see, for the same day, there

July 22, 2021

1 is a different -- there's actually a different
2 entry. Do you see that, the same date and
3 time, November 3, 2020 at 1500?

4 A. Yes, I see that.

5 Q. It says, interaction with civil
6 society organizations on UN topics; right?

7 A. That's what it says.

8 Q. Right. And so I guess what I'm
9 wondering is which one of those -- I assume
10 that those entries are intended to refer to the
11 same event because they're at the same time and
12 on the same date and they are the only ones on
13 that date and time.

14 A. I think -- I believe that the entry
15 that says, internal Palestine Mission business,
16 is the correct entry. That is not --

17 Q. Okay. Understood. I was just
18 trying to clarify the discrepancy between the
19 two documents.

20 So this one here, so whatever
21 happened on November 3, 2020 at 1500 in your
22 calendar, that was not interaction with civil
23 society organizations on UN topics?

24 A. No, it was not.

25 Q. Is that right?

July 22, 2021

1 A. You are correct.

2 Q. It was an error. That's fine.

3 Okay.

4 MR. SINAIKO: Could we go back
5 to the Exhibit 6 now? Thanks, Cosette.

6 Okay. And let's go to December 2nd
7 of 2020. And I'm looking at 2000 hours.

8 BY MR. SINAIKO:

9 Q. It says, interaction with Division
10 For Palestinian Rights?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Tell me what the nature of the event
13 was that this entry refers to.

14 A. It was a meeting with the UN
15 Division For Palestinian Rights.

16 Q. What is the Division For Palestinian
17 Rights? Sorry for not knowing.

18 A. It is the UN Secretary Support Unit
19 for the UN Committee on the Exercise of the
20 Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People,
21 and it's a General Assembly mandated
22 department.

23 Q. Got it. Go to the -- 2100.

24 A. I'm sorry, what was the date?

25 Q. September 8th of 2020.

July 22, 2021

1 A. Uh-huh.

2 Q. 2100. I mean, I recognize these are
3 just the times that are on the list. They are
4 not --

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. You know, I assume that it wasn't at
7 9:00 at night, and it doesn't much matter.

8 Do you see, it says, interaction
9 with Peter Mulrean, former UNRWA representative
10 in New York?

11 A. Right.

12 Q. And who is Mr. Mulrean?

13 A. Peter Mulrean was formally the UNRWA
14 representative in New York, and it was a phone
15 call to discuss the status of UNRWA at the time
16 in -- as of December of 2020, but it was also a
17 friendly phone call because Peter had retired.

18 Q. Got it. And can you tell me more
19 specifically what you discussed with
20 Mr. Mulrean?

21 A. We discussed the status of UNRWA.

22 Q. When you say "the status of UNRWA,"
23 what do you mean?

24 A. UNRWA was experiencing financial
25 difficulties towards the end of 2020, and

July 22, 2021

1 Peter, as a representative of UNRWA prior to
2 his retirement, was very much involved in
3 seeking international support to UNRWA,
4 including humanitarian funding support.

5 Q. And by the fall or by, I guess, the
6 date, December 8th of 2020, was it the case
7 that personnel from the Observer Mission were
8 back in the building, at least on an occasional
9 basis?

10 A. At least, yes, on an occasional
11 basis.

12 Q. Do you know where you were when you
13 had this conversation with Mr. Mulrean on
14 December 8th of 2020?

15 A. I was at home.

16 Q. And going back for a moment to the
17 discussion that you had with Professor Boon's
18 students at Seton Hall, that we discussed a few
19 minutes ago, where were you physically located
20 when you had that conversation?

21 A. I was at home.

22 Q. All right. Let's go to the next
23 page. Looking at January 27, 2021, 1630
24 hours --

25 A. Uh-huh.

July 22, 2021

1 Q. There it is. Okay. Do you see that
2 says, interaction with DPR?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. What was the nature of the event
5 reflected in this entry in the calendar?

6 A. So, actually, that is one of the
7 examples of the duplications. I think that
8 when I exported my calendar to Excel,
9 interaction with DPR is the same thing as the
10 interaction relating to division mapping
11 project meeting.

12 DPR refers, in this case, to the
13 Division For Palestinian Rights. The entry
14 above it was Division.

15 The way that this happened is that I
16 put in the entry, which is much more
17 descriptive, interaction relating to division
18 mapping project meeting, in my calendar. When
19 the division sent me an invite to MS Teams and
20 I clicked accept, then it comes alongside that
21 and they called it, you know, DPR.

22 That is their handle. And so there
23 are two entries at the same time. But it is
24 only --

25 Q. Got it.

July 22, 2021

1 A. -- because I accepted the
2 invitation.

3 Q. Understood. And what is the
4 division mapping project?

5 A. It is a project that the UN Division
6 for Palestinian Rights is undertaking to map
7 the voting patterns of UN Member States on the
8 Palestine question.

9 Q. And what does DPR stand for? Oh,
10 that's Division of Palestinian Rights?

11 A. Correct.

12 Q. I was just reacting to the entry
13 immediately below which also uses that, but I
14 think I know what DPR refers to in that second
15 entry. Maybe you can just tell us what it is.

16 A. It is, typically, used to refer to
17 any Deputy Permanent Representative at the UN.

18 Q. And in the case of your entry on
19 January 28, 2021, for 1800, that DPR of Japan
20 refers to the Deputy Permanent Representative
21 of Japan to the United Nations?

22 A. Correct.

23 Q. Okey-dokey. Go to February 25th of
24 2021, at 1930. And you see this one says,
25 interaction with Muna Amara, student working on

July 22, 2021

1 Master's thesis on the Palestine question at
2 the UN Security Council?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. What does this entry reflect?

5 A. It reflects a phone conversation
6 that I had with a student, after she conveyed a
7 request to the Palestine Mission to speak with
8 one of the diplomats to better inform her
9 thesis on the Palestine question and,
10 particularly, at the Security Council because
11 she was researching the comparison between
12 resolutions adopted under Chapter 6 or Chapter
13 7 of the charter.

14 Q. And where were you physically
15 located when you had this conversation with
16 Muna?

17 A. I was at home.

18 Q. Let's go to March 1 of 2021, at
19 1900. Do you see that? It says, interaction
20 with US UNSC?

21 A. Uh-huh.

22 Q. What does that entry reflect?

23 A. That is with the -- that was a
24 meeting with the U.S. -- the U.S. Mission team
25 to the UN Security Council.

July 22, 2021

1 Q. And let's go to March 4, at 2020 --
2 March 4, 2021, at 2200.

3 A. Uh-huh.

4 Q. Do you see that says, interaction
5 with APG DPR?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Can you tell me what that entry
8 reflects?

9 A. That is the -- APG refers to the
10 Asia-Pacific Group at the United Nations, and
11 it is the DPR group of the Asia-Pacific
12 countries.

13 Q. What is the DPR group of the
14 Asia-Pacific countries?

15 A. It is the Deputy Permanent
16 Representatives of each of the Asia-Pacific
17 countries.

18 Q. Got it. Okay. Thank you. Let's go
19 to March 19, 2021 at 1300.

20 A. Uh-huh.

21 Q. Do you see that entry -- that entry
22 reads, interaction relating to "meeting on
23 Afghan women"?

24 A. Correct.

25 Q. Can you tell me what that entry

July 22, 2021

1 reflects?

2 A. That was a UN meeting on the
3 situation of Afghan women. March is when the
4 UN Commission on the Status of Women is
5 convened every year. The Afghan Ambassador had
6 asked if I could be present. And Afghanistan
7 is a Vice Chair of the UN Committee on the
8 Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the
9 Palestinian People. I attended their event in
10 solidarity. It was a virtual event. I was a
11 passive participant. I did not speak.

12 Q. Now, let's go to March 19 at 1700,
13 which is actually the penultimate entry on this
14 page.

15 A. Uh-huh. Yes.

16 Q. Do you see, that says, interaction
17 with Itay of Norwegian Refugee Council civil
18 society organization on UN topics. Do you see?

19 A. Correct, yes, I see it.

20 Q. Can you tell us what that entry
21 reflects?

22 A. Itay Epshtain, again, of the
23 Norwegian Refugee Council, had reached out to
24 me regarding the submission of a new NRC report
25 to the human rights -- to the UN Human Rights

July 22, 2021

1 Council, and he was actually physically present
2 in New York at that time and had been meeting
3 with various UN Missions about the NRC report
4 on the humanitarian situation in the occupied
5 Palestinian territory. But I did not meet with
6 him in person. We met virtually by Zoom.

7 Q. And where were you physically
8 located when you did that?

9 A. I was at home. I had not yet been
10 vaccinated.

11 Q. Okay. Let's go to the very next
12 entry on the page. It says, interaction with
13 PAL DPR. That one is another one where it
14 looks like the two entries have the same date
15 and timestamp. I wonder if that might not be
16 another instance of a double entry?

17 A. I think that is one of them. So
18 that is the Division for Palestinian Rights
19 again, and I think that that was a meeting that
20 should have been canceled in my calendar,
21 because it had been postponed to a later date
22 because I would not have been able to double
23 book.

24 Q. What is PAL DPR?

25 A. The Division for Palestinian Rights.

July 22, 2021

1 Q. Got it. Okay. Let's go to March
2 30, 2021 at 1700. Do you see this one says,
3 interaction with Yale University civil society
4 organization on UN topics?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And what is the civil society
7 organization to which this entry refers?

8 A. It was a Yale University student
9 paper, one of the journalists for their student
10 paper that wanted to talk about the medical
11 situation in Palestine, UN support to Palestine
12 in the context of COVID-19 and vaccines, the
13 access to vaccines.

14 Q. Do you know -- do you understand
15 that the person -- let me just back up a little
16 bit.

17 What was the nature of the event
18 that's reflected in this entry?

19 A. It was a phone call. That was the
20 event.

21 Q. Phone call between yourself and a
22 student journalist?

23 A. Yes. She had sent an E-mail to the
24 Palestine Mission, to our general Mission
25 E-mail. It was forwarded to me by a secretary

July 22, 2021

1 who said, can you speak to her to answer her
2 questions, and I did.

3 Q. And do you know what publication
4 this student journalist worked for?

5 A. It was a Yale University newsletter
6 or paper.

7 Q. Got it. And did you speak with the
8 student -- well, strike that.

9 Do you recall the name of the
10 student journalist you spoke with?

11 A. I recall her first name was Ruqaiya.

12 Q. I'm sorry?

13 A. Ruqaiya. Her first name was
14 Ruqaiya.

15 Q. Can you spell that?

16 A. It was R-U-Q-A-I-Y-A.

17 MR. BERGER: Just like it
18 sounds.

19 MR. SINAIKO: Sure. I tried,
20 but I'm not that good.

21 BY MR. SINAIKO:

22 Q. When you spoke with this student
23 journalist, you were acting in your official
24 capacity as Deputy Permanent Observer; correct?

25 A. Yes, I was. As I said, she reached

July 22, 2021

1 out to the Palestine Mission to speak with a
2 representative of the Mission to the UN to gain
3 further knowledge on the subject.

4 Q. Was this student looking for a
5 particular type of comment from you?

6 A. She asked me several questions about
7 the COVID-19 situation in Palestine and about
8 access to vaccines and the kind of assistance
9 and support that Palestine was receiving in
10 accessing vaccines, including through the UN
11 COVAX facility.

12 Q. Do you know whether your comments to
13 the student journalist actually made their way
14 into a publication of any kind?

15 A. I'm not sure. I don't know.

16 Q. You don't know one way or the other;
17 correct?

18 A. I mean, I'm assuming she may have
19 used it for -- to inform her article.

20 Q. But you don't know?

21 A. I don't know.

22 Q. One way or the other, you don't
23 know?

24 A. No, I don't know. I have not seen a
25 piece that had been produced. It may have

July 22, 2021

1 been, but I have not read it.

2 Q. And was one of your purposes in
3 speaking to the student journalist to advocate
4 for the Palestinian cause?

5 A. In my capacity as the Ambassador,
6 Deputy Permanent Observer of the State of
7 Palestine, I always speak in support of the
8 Palestinian people and in support of the cause.

9 And so I would always speak
10 favorably in regards to Palestinian rights,
11 including their right in the midst of a global
12 pandemic, to access vaccines and medical
13 assistance.

14 Q. Let's go to April 20, 2021 at 1500
15 hours. Do you see this one? Can you read that
16 entry for me?

17 A. Yes. Interaction with civil society
18 organization Wayne Hills High School on UN
19 topics.

20 Q. And what is Wayne Hills High School,
21 to your knowledge?

22 A. It is a high school in Wayne, New
23 Jersey.

24 Q. And you regard Wayne Hills High
25 School as a civil society organization?

July 22, 2021

1 A. I do. Schools are part of larger
2 civil society, many schools participate in
3 Model UNs. In a non-pandemic year, we might
4 get multiple requests by schools whose Model UN
5 team is assigned to represent Palestine, again,
6 a very big topic at the UN, and so the schools
7 often reach out to have Palestinian diplomats
8 inform their students so they can better model
9 our delegation at the UN conferences or
10 simulations that they participate in.

11 Q. So any high school, any college, any
12 educational institution qualifies as a civil
13 society organization in your view?

14 MR. BERGER: So that's at
15 least the sixth time you have asked that
16 question. So I will object that it has been
17 asked and answered and it's still
18 argumentative.

19 BY MR. SINAIKO:

20 Q. You can answer.

21 MR. BERGER: You may answer.

22 MR. SINAIKO: Can the court
23 reporter read the question back, please?

24 (Reporter read back from the
25 record.)

July 22, 2021

1 THE WITNESS: Yes, in my view,
2 schools, universities, colleges, qualify as
3 civil society because they are non-governmental
4 institutions, entities, that are engaged in
5 organized functions such as education, training
6 and otherwise.

7 BY MR. SINAIKO:

8 Q. And can you provide a description of
9 the event that is reflected in this interaction
10 with civil society organization Wayne Hills
11 High School on UN topics entry in your
12 calendar?

13 A. Yes. So the professor, the teacher,
14 asked me to speak to his history class because
15 they had been studying the Middle East, they
16 had been studying Israel/Palestine. He was --
17 I don't know if the Israeli representative
18 spoke before me to the students or after, but
19 he wanted to present both sides of the story to
20 his high school students to inform them.

21 And he wanted them to understand
22 about the diplomatic process at the UN on this
23 issue.

24 Q. Were there any participants -- well,
25 do you remember the name of the teacher?

July 22, 2021

1 A. The teacher's name was Chris, either
2 Ness or van Ness.

3 Q. And the teacher's students, were
4 they participants in this call as well?

5 A. Yes, they were. They were on the
6 Zoom.

7 Q. And where were you physically
8 located when you participated in this Zoom
9 call?

10 A. I was still at home. I had not yet
11 been vaccinated.

12 Q. And you mentioned a moment ago that
13 either before or after you spoke to this class,
14 a representative of Israel also spoke to them;
15 correct?

16 A. I was informed by the teacher that
17 this is their -- this is how they do things,
18 that they like to present both sides.

19 Q. Understood. So your position in
20 speaking with these students, then, was to
21 present the Palestinian side; correct?

22 A. It was to present Palestine's
23 diplomatic work at the UN. That is what I can
24 speak to. That is what I have been doing for
25 29 years.

July 22, 2021

1 Q. Understood. It was to present the
2 Palestinian side of the story; correct?

3 A. It was to present the efforts of
4 Palestine at the UN in the context of an
5 ongoing search for the achievement of
6 Palestinian rights, justice and a peaceful
7 solution to the Israeli/Palestinian conflict.

8 And as a diplomat, it is always my
9 objective to present the peaceful diplomatic
10 search for a solution to the
11 Israeli/Palestinian conflict as the best way to
12 resolve the conflict.

13 Q. And you made that presentation to a
14 group of high school students; correct?

15 A. Correct.

16 Q. Let's go to April 26, 2021 at 1400.
17 That's just a few stops down the page.

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Do you see that one? It says,
20 interaction with civil society organization HRW
21 on UN topics.

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. What is HRW?

24 A. It is Human Rights Watch.

25 Q. What is Human Rights Watch?

July 22, 2021

1 A. It is a global human rights
2 organization, non-governmental organization.

3 Q. And what is the nature of the event
4 that is reflected in this entry from your
5 calendar?

6 A. Human Rights Watch was going to
7 present or launch a new report that they had
8 done that concerned Israel/Palestine, and the
9 representative of Human Rights Watch to the UN,
10 Louis Charbonneau, with two of his colleagues,
11 were -- had reached out to the Mission to
12 discuss the report and the possibility of
13 presenting the report at the UN, including in
14 an event that would be hosted by the UN
15 Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable
16 Rights of the Palestinian People.

17 Q. And do you know whether this report
18 was, in fact, presented at the United Nations?

19 A. It was presented by a discussion in
20 which one of the authors of the Human Rights
21 Watch report participated in an event that was
22 hosted by the UN, yes.

23 Q. And what was the content of this
24 report, if you know?

25 A. It was called A Threshold Crossed,

July 22, 2021

1 and it concerned the determination by Human
2 Rights Watch that Israel has crossed the line
3 and it practices apartheid.

4 Q. And what was the purpose of your
5 discussion on April 26, 2021 with Human Rights
6 Watch concerning this report?

7 A. They reached out to us to inform us
8 about the impending launch of the report and to
9 explore the possibility of presenting the
10 report within the UN context.

11 Q. What aspect of that were they
12 looking to discuss with you?

13 A. Well, Palestine is a member of the
14 UN Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable
15 Rights of the Palestinian People as well as the
16 bureau, and often, virtual events are held
17 where civil society organizations present to
18 the committee, present reports, their work.

19 It can be international civil
20 society organizations like Human Rights Watch,
21 like Amnesty International, it can be Israeli
22 human rights organizations like B'Tselem, Yesh
23 Din. It can be Palestinian human rights
24 organizations like Al-Haq or others.

25 So they were exploring the

July 22, 2021

1 possibility of making a presentation of their
2 report to the committee.

3 Q. And what were they -- I mean, what,
4 if anything, were they looking for from you in
5 that regard?

6 MR. BERGER: Objection, calls
7 for speculation.

8 BY MR. SINAIKO:

9 Q. So far as you understand.

10 A. They were presenting to us the
11 substance of the report so that we could make a
12 recommendation to the committee and the bureau
13 as to whether this would be appropriate to
14 present in the UN context.

15 Q. Okay. Let's go back to Exhibit 4.
16 We can put it on the screen. I don't know,
17 Ambassador Abdelhady-Nasser, do you have a
18 physical copy of the document in front of you
19 now?

20 A. I do.

21 Q. Oh, good. We can -- I mean, if it's
22 more convenient, we can just work from the
23 physical copy. That's fine. We don't have to
24 take up screen space with it. So long as you
25 have Exhibit 4 in front of you.

July 22, 2021

1 A. I do.

2 Q. Then we can -- Okey-doke. Let's go
3 to February 12, 2020 at 2115. Do you see that
4 entry there?

5 A. Yes, I do.

6 Q. Can you read that to us?

7 A. Women's Foreign Policy Group.

8 Q. What is the Women's Foreign Policy
9 Group?

10 A. It is an NGO that discusses foreign
11 policy from a woman's perspective.

12 Q. And that NGO is not in any way
13 affiliated with the United Nations; correct?

14 A. I believe it is accredited to the
15 United Nations.

16 Q. And what was the nature of the event
17 that's reflected in this entry on your
18 calendar?

19 A. I don't exactly remember the topic
20 of discussion. I receive regular invitations
21 from the Women's Foreign Policy Group to come
22 and hear speakers make presentations. I'm,
23 typically, just a participant, a passive
24 participant.

25 Q. In this instance, did you attend the

July 22, 2021

1 event?

2 A. I believe that I did, yes.

3 Q. And were you a speaker at this
4 event?

5 A. No, I was not. I was listening to a
6 presentation. It couldn't have been that
7 interesting because I can't remember it.

8 Q. Let's go down to the bottom of the
9 Page, August -- April 29 at 13:00. Do you see
10 that one says, dialogue entitled COVID-19,
11 strengthening the international system amid
12 global crisis response and recovery?

13 A. I'm sorry, could you repeat the date
14 to me, please?

15 Q. Certainly. It's April 29, 2020 at
16 1300 --

17 A. Okay. Yes.

18 Q. So you see that that one is titled,
19 dialogue entitled "COVID-19, Strengthening the
20 International System Amid Global Crisis
21 Response and Recovery"?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. What is the nature of the event
24 that's reflected in that calendar entry?

25 A. So UN Missions often host what they

July 22, 2021

1 call side events, and they are, typically,
2 informative meetings where experts are brought
3 to discuss any range of subjects, and that was
4 the prevalent theme at the time.

5 So we may have received an
6 invitation from a UN Mission to attend this
7 side event, which was virtual. And often, we
8 attend just as part of the UN community. We
9 are not participating actually in the dialogue.
10 We are an attendee being informed.

11 Q. And in this instance, do you know
12 whether you were an attendee being informed?

13 A. I certainly was. I knew nothing
14 about pandemic response or recovery as of April
15 2020. We were living the pandemic.

16 Q. We all were.

17 A. Yeah.

18 Q. Okay. You didn't speak at this
19 event?

20 A. No, I did not.

21 Q. Let's go to the entry on May 5, 2020
22 at 1845 hours. I'm just reading the timestamp
23 that's in the margin. I'm not saying that
24 that's right. I think, actually, we know that
25 that's not right but it doesn't matter.

July 22, 2021

1 A. Uh-huh.

2 Q. Phone call with Nabil Abi-Saab; do
3 you see that?

4 A. Yes, I do.

5 Q. Who is Nabil Abi-Saab?

4 A. My new title and new position was
5 the advisor on media affairs.

6 Q. Advisor on media affairs, okay. And
7 is that the title that you currently hold at
8 the Observer Mission?

11 times since January 4 of 2020?

1 A. To enhance and, basically, project
2 the work of the United Nations in hopes of
3 accomplishing their mandate of seeing a just
4 resolution to the Palestine question.

5 Q. And when you say promoting, you
6 know, when you say promoting, who do you --
7 promoting to who?

8 A. To the international community and
9 to whoever chooses to sign in, listen to
10 whatever the mandate that the UN has.

11 Q. So that would include, for example,
12 the American public?

13 MR. BERGER: Objection, first
14 of all, she didn't use the word "promoting" and
15 you have loaded up the question with that. So
16 I object to the form of the question as
17 misstating her prior testimony, but you may
18 answer.

19 THE WITNESS: It includes
20 anybody in the international community that
21 would like to voluntarily log in to our various
22 media platforms that are tied to the UN
23 mandate.

24 So if the American public is -- are
25 people that want to chime in, they are more

1 than welcome to.

2 BY MR. SINAIKO:

3 Q. Would it be fair to say that the
4 purpose -- the purpose of media affairs is to
5 get the broadest possible attention to the work
6 of the Observer Mission?

7 A. I think it would be fair to say that
8 the purpose of the media is to bring as much
9 attention to the plight of the illegal
10 occupation of the Palestinian people as
11 mandated through our work with the United
12 Nations.

13 Q. Okay. So is there, in your view, a
14 material difference between the role you play
15 at the Observer Mission today and the role you
16 previously played when you worked at the
17 Palestinian Diplomatic Mission to the United
18 States?

19 A. Absolutely, yes.

20 Q. And what is the difference?

21 A. When I worked at the UN Mission to
22 the U.S., I worked as a public relations and
23 outreach advisor -- well, a director, I should
24 say, and now that I am employed at the UN
25 Mission of the Permanent Observer State of

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1 (Discussion held off the
2 record.)

3 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are
4 back on the record. The time is 14:37 UTC

6 BY MR. SINAIKO:

7 Q. Ms. Ghannam, you mentioned a moment

13 involving issues that don't fall within the

8 mandated work. It's not part of our portfolio.
9 Whenever I get requests for BDS, I throw it
10 out.

11 Q. Maybe I could ask the question in a
12 different way, then. On and after January 4,
13 2020, what are the issues that you regard as
14 falling within the policy work of the Observer
15 Mission at the United Nations?

17 the form of the question. She has never used
18 the phrase "policy work at the United Nations."
19 It's your phrase.

11 know this better than I do because you are the
12 media affairs person; is it possible to create
13 similar restrictions with respect to a Twitter
14 account?

15 A. That is a good question. I don't
16 think so.

17 Q. Okay. So, to your knowledge --

18 A. No.

19 Q. To your knowledge, any person with
20 access to Twitter can see anything that the
21 Observer Mission posts on its Twitter account?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Okay. So as far as you know, the
24 information that you post to the Observer
25 Mission's Twitter account goes to the public at

1 large; correct?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Would it be fair to say that you
4 regard it as important that the Observer
5 Mission's Facebook and Twitter account postings
6 get the broadest possible distribution?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. And the Twitter and Facebook account
9 postings that you make to the accounts that are
10 maintained by the Observer Mission, are those
11 accounts -- are those postings ever in a
12 language other than English?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. How frequently are there postings
15 that are not in the English language?

16 A. Very, very, very infrequently.

17 Q. Very infrequently?

18 A. Correct.

19 Q. So would you say that in excess of
20 90 percent of the postings on the Observer
21 Mission's Facebook and Twitter accounts are in
22 the English language?

23 A. If not more, yes.

24 Q. Okay. And, again, this will be a
25 question I'm asking you because you probably

1 know this stuff better than I do being the
2 media affairs person; what is the function of a
3 hashtag on a Twitter post or a Facebook post?

4 A. So that people can follow it in the
5 search engine.

6 Q. When you say so people can follow it
7 in a search engine, what do you mean exactly?

8 A. So, for example, in Twitter, there
9 are certain things that are trending, things
10 trend, that's how you know what's popular.

11 So, for example, recently, one of
12 the hashtags I have been using is
13 SaveSheikhJarrah, it's a hashtag, is the
14 illegal move by settlers or whatever to remove
15 people who have lived in this neighborhood for
16 decades.

17 So it's trending. So people -- if
18 you put in the hashtag, #SaveSheikhJarrah, you
19 can then begin to see who is tweeting any
20 information under that specific hashtag.

21 Q. So would it be fair to say, then,
22 that using the hashtag SaveSheikhJarrah is a
23 means of getting attention to Twitter or
24 Facebook posts that are on the Observer Mission
25 account and that relate to that topic?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. And would it be fair to say that the
3 use of hashtags, again, I'll just restrict it
4 for the moment to the SaveSheikhJarrah hashtag,
5 that the use of that hashtag enhances the
6 ability of the Mission to disseminate its
7 message around activities related to Sheikh
8 Jarrah?

9 A. If you are a Twitter user and you
10 know how to use Twitter, you would know that
11 hashtags are the only way that your message is
12 going to get disseminated widely. Otherwise,
13 it just falls to the fray.

14 Q. So would it be fair to say that the
15 very purpose of putting hashtags on these
16 messages or these Twitter postings and Facebook
17 postings is to ensure that your -- that the
18 postings reach the broadest possible audience?

19 A. Correct.

20 Q. Okay. And it's your intention, by
21 using hashtags, to ensure that the postings on
22 the Observer Mission's Twitter and Facebook
23 feeds reach the broadest possible audience;
24 correct?

25 A. Not always. Sometimes I hashtag

1 information that isn't necessarily going to get
2 a wide, broad audience, but it's the ethical
3 and the right thing to do based on the UN
4 mandate.

5 There might be, for example,
6 Resolution 2334, that is not a hashtag you are
7 ever going to find trending. However, because
8 I like to educate the public and that's one of
9 the mandates of the UN is to educate, I will
10 hashtag 2334 in hopes that maybe one person
11 might get educated and that's enough for me.
12 So it really varies, the strategy varies every
13 single time. So it's not necessarily a means
14 to get the word out to as many people as
15 possible.

16 Q. So to take the SaveSheikhJarrah
17 hashtag for just a moment, I think you said you
18 use that one; right?

19 A. That is correct.

20 Q. And the use of the SaveSheikhJarrah
21 hashtag, the purpose of that is to ensure the
22 widest possible dissemination of the message
23 that the Observer Mission is disseminating in
24 its Facebook and Twitter posts on that topic;
25 correct?

1 A. Yes, although I don't use hashtags
2 as frequently on Facebook. I do do it just for
3 an aesthetic thing. It looks nice. And for
4 people who follow both platforms, sometimes
5 they link onto Twitter and Facebook, but
6 hashtags are more so used for Twitter.

7 Q. Okay. So, again, the purpose, then,
8 restricting it to Twitter for a moment, the use
9 of the SaveSheikhJarrah hashtag on Twitter, the
10 purpose of using that hashtag is to ensure the
11 broadest possible dissemination of the messages
12 on that topic that the Observer Mission, you
13 know, posts to its Twitter account?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Okay. And in the instance of
16 SaveSheikhJarrah, just to take that as an
17 example, the message that the Observer Mission
18 disseminates through its Twitter and Facebook
19 feeds is that activity relating to Sheikh
20 Jarrah is illegal; correct?

21 A. Correct. The UN has circulated many
22 documents, articles, so forth, stating what is
23 happening in Sheikh Jarrah is illegal and it is
24 against UN human rights policies, international
25 law, international human rights laws, various

1 UN resolutions, and it's illegal in nature.

2 And yes, therefore, it was in the
3 framework of my work to disseminate information
4 within the context of the United Nations.

5 Q. Right. And disseminating the view
6 of the Observer Mission that activity relating
7 to Sheikh Jarrah is illegal is an important
8 part of your work at the Observer Mission;
9 correct?

10 A. Yes, because part of my work is to
11 elevate the messaging of the United Nations.
12 That's part of my work as the media advisor.

13 Q. Well, let me ask this. Isn't it to
14 elevate the work of the --

15 A. In the United Nations because it's
16 not just the Permanent Observer Mission of the
17 State of Palestine that ties onto these
18 documents. There are many countries that are
19 in agreement. I mean, many.

20 I mean, if you log onto Security
21 Council meetings, you can hear Ireland, you can
22 hear Norway, you can hear many of these
23 countries who take the lead. We're not even --
24 we can't even be a permanent representative in
25 the Security Council so many countries speak on

1 the illegal occupation of the State of
2 Palestine. It's not just our mandate.

3 Q. I didn't mean to interrupt. I'm so
4 sorry. I think I might have cut you off
5 inadvertently.

6 A. That's okay.

7 Q. Your Twitter posts -- not your
8 Twitter posts, the Twitter posts that go on the
9 Observer Mission's Twitter and Facebook feeds,
10 those are the messaging of the Observer Mission
11 and not of the United Nations and not of any
12 other -- any Member State or any other member
13 organization; correct?

14 A. That is correct.

15 Q. Okay. When you post to -- well, let
16 me ask this. On and after January 4, 2020, I
17 think we have established that you are the only
18 person who has posted to the Observer Mission's
19 Twitter and Facebook accounts; correct?

20 A. Correct.

21 Q. And on and after January 4, 2020,
22 have you made posts to those two social media
23 accounts, that is, the Facebook account and the
24 Twitter account, from the Observer Mission
25 building at 115 East 65th Street in Manhattan?

1 A. Since January 4?

2 Q. Since January 4 of 2020, that is
3 correct.

4 A. Yes, I have.

5 Q. And how many times would you say,
6 just ballpark, on and after January 4, 2020,
7 you have posted to the Twitter account or the
8 Facebook account of the Observer Mission from
9 the Observer Mission building at 115 East 65th
10 Street in Manhattan?

11 A. To take a guess, February, Twitter,
12 maybe 60 times. Facebook, maybe 15 times.
13 Maybe a dozen times.

14 Q. And the reason that that number is
15 in the range you just mentioned is because of
16 the pandemic; correct?

17 A. That is correct.

18 Q. And subsequent to, on or subsequent
19 to January 4, 2020, how many times would you
20 say you have posted or you have made a post to
21 the Observer Mission's Facebook account?

22 A. After January 4 -- excuse me, 2020?

23 Q. On and after January 4 of 2020.

24 A. Facebook? God, I mean, I don't
25 know. I just don't know. That's just a very

1 specific question. I don't know. Maybe once a
2 week. Do the math. I don't know. Once a week
3 since January 2020, on average.

4 Q. So you use Facebook -- oh, sorry.
5 Didn't mean to interrupt.

6 A. It's okay. I can't do the math in
7 my head for you. I don't know.

8 Q. Would it be fair to say that you
9 post to the Observer Mission's Facebook account
10 less than you post to the Observer Mission's
11 Twitter account?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. Okay. On and after January 4 of
14 2020, how many times would you say that you
15 have posted to the Observer Mission's Twitter
16 account from the building at 115 East 65th
17 Street?

18 A. From the building, like I said,
19 probably around 60 times. I'm just averaging
20 once a day.

21 Q. Okay. And putting aside -- you
22 know, putting aside from the building, you
23 know, from the building at 115 East 65th
24 Street, how many times would you say, in total,
25 you have posted to the Observer Mission's

1 Twitter account on or after January 4, 2020?

2 A. I couldn't even count. Wouldn't
3 even be able to give you a ballpark. A lot.

4 Q. But it's a large number; right?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And are you aware, I don't know,
7 I'll ask, are you aware of the location of the
8 servers where the Facebook and Twitter accounts

15 withdrawn.

23 Observer Mission Twitter account, on and after

6 have you left the territory of the United
7 States?

23 copy of the official position that the PLO
24 Department of Public Diplomacy and Policy
25 released along with this tweet?

1 A. It looks like it was down to me.
2 There is nothing written in it other than
3 something in Arabic and it was just one word.

4 Q. Oh. Let's go to the next page. I
5 think there was probably some text at the
6 bottom that you were having difficulty seeing.

7 A. Oh, I can't -- there's no way I can
8 read that.

9 Q. Let's zoom in a little bit. There
10 we go. Is that better?

11 A. Yes, it's better. I mean, I'm not
12 going to read all of it. It's going to waste
13 everyone's time. Okay. What is the question?

14 Q. So the question is, is that the
15 position statement that was attached to the PLO
16 Department of Public Diplomacy -- I'm sorry,
17 Public Diplomacy and Policy that was attached
18 to the tweet that the Observer Mission
19 retweeted?

20 A. It appears so, if it is attached to
21 it.

22 MR. SINAIKO: Let's go to Tab
23 20, and we will mark that as Exhibit 7.

24 (Deposition Exhibit No. 7 was
25 marked for identification.)

1 BY MR. SINAIKO:

2 Q. And do you recognize this to be
3 another tweet that was posted to the Observer
4 Mission's Twitter feed?

5 A. I retweeted it, but yes.

6 Q. Well, I mean, I guess it's a
7 question. Do you recognize this to be a tweet
8 that you posted to the Observer Mission's
9 Twitter account?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Okay.

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And you see that this document has
14 the hashtag LandsDay?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. Is the hashtag LandsDay one of those
17 hashtags that's designed to maximize the
18 dissemination of the message in the tweet?

19 A. That particular context, I am not
20 sure if I was trying to maximize it or just
21 commemorate the day.

22 Q. In general, though -- well,
23 withdrawn.

24 And in this tweet, you are actually
25 retweeting -- well, withdrawn. Let me try this

1 question one more time.

2 This is actually a retweet of a
3 tweet that was posted by another organization
4 within the Palestine Liberation Organization;
5 correct?

6 A. Yes, the Negotiation Affairs
7 Department, yes.

8 Q. Okay. And the purpose of this tweet
9 was to disseminate publicly the Observer
10 Mission's view and the view of the PLO that
11 Israel was engaged in violations against the
12 land and people of Palestine; is that correct?

13 MR. BERGER: Object to the
14 form of the question.

15 BY MR. SINAIKO:

16 Q. You may answer.

17 A. The purpose of this tweet is to
18 highlight the violations that the United
19 Nations continuously addresses against the
20 people of Palestine and those that are
21 illegally occupied.

22 These violations are deemed by --
23 against many international human rights groups,
24 international human rights law, so these are
25 violations not just by Palestinian Missions to

1 the United Nations, but violations that are
2 also discussed at the United Nations.

3 Q. Okay. But the purpose of the tweet
4 is, just to cut through it, one of the purposes
5 of the tweet, at least, is to publicize these
6 -- these violations; correct?

7 MR. BERGER: Object to the
8 form of the question. Asked and answered.

9 BY MR. SINAIKO:

10 Q. You may answer. Do you need the
11 question back?

12 A. No. The purpose of the tweet is to,
13 once again, highlight the illegal violations,
14 as noted in the United Nations, that are
15 conducted against a people that are occupied.
16 This is something that is legally embedded in
17 the charter of the United Nations. Therefore,
18 once again, I am doing my work as the advisor
19 to the Permanent Observer Mission of the State
20 of Palestine to the United Nations to educate
21 people on violations that are deemed illegal by
22 the United Nations.

23 Q. Understood.

24 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. Let's go
25 to our next tab. This is going to be Tab 22.

1 I think we'll mark it as Exhibit 7; is that
2 right?

3 THE COURT REPORTER: Exhibit
4 8.

5 MR. SINAIKO: Exhibit 8,
6 sorry.

7 (Deposition Exhibit No. 8 was
8 marked for identification.)

9 BY MR. SINAIKO:

10 Q. Oh, I'm so sorry, I meant to put up
11 Tab 21. And, actually, before we do that, let
12 me just go back to -- let me go back to -- let
13 me go back to Tab 19. That's Exhibit 6. Yeah.
14 Let's just go back to that for one moment.

15 So this tweet here, you see at the
16 -- you see underneath the tweet, it's dated
17 1:59 p.m. -- do you have Exhibit 6 in front of
18 you on the screen? I can't hear you, ma'am.

19 Ms. Ghannam, can you hear me? I'm
20 having difficulty hearing anything right now.

21 THE COURT REPORTER: I cannot
22 hear her either.

23 MR. SINAIKO: I think we have
24 lost the audio.

25 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Would you

1 like to go off the record?

2 MR. SINAIKO: Well, we need to
3 get the audio working. I mean, whatever we
4 have to do. If we have to go off the record to
5 get the audio working, then fine.

6 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Okay. We
7 are now off the record. The time is 17:24 UTC
8 time.

9 (Discussion held off the
10 record.)

11 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are
12 back on the record. The time is 17:26 UTC
13 time.

14 BY MR. SINAIKO:

15 Q. Ms. Ghannam, we are back on the
16 record. Can you see that I have put Exhibit 6,
17 Deposition Exhibit 6 back on the screen in
18 front of you?

19 A. Yes, I can see it.

20 Q. And this is the retweet that we were
21 talking about a moment ago; correct?

22 A. Correct.

23 Q. Okay. And if you look at the bottom
24 of the tweet, you will see that it says, 1:59
25 p.m., February 4, 2020. Do you see that?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Would you agree that this was a
3 tweet that was posted at 1:59 p.m. on the 4th
4 of February 2020?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. Okay. And would you agree that this
7 is a tweet that you posted from the UN --
8 withdrawn.

9 Would you agree that this is a post
10 that -- to Twitter that you made from the
11 Observer Mission building at 115 East 65th
12 Street in Manhattan at the date and time noted
13 on the tweet?

14 A. Most likely, yes, unless I wasn't
15 tweeting from my lunch break because it's close
16 to 2:00.

17 Q. But you would say most likely, just
18 to be clear, you would say most likely --

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. -- you tweeted that from inside the
21 Observer Mission building at 115 East 65th
22 Street in Manhattan?

23 A. Most likely, yes.

24 Q. Let's go back to tab, I think we
25 said Tab 21, and we're marking that as Exhibit

1 8.

2 MR. SINAIKO: Karen, did you
3 get that?

4 THE COURT REPORTER: Yes.
5 Exhibit 8, yes.

6 MR. SINAIKO: Yeah. Let's put
7 up Tab 21. That will be Exhibit 8.

8 BY MR. SINAIKO:

9 Q. All right. And Ms. Ghannam, do you
10 see Exhibit 8 in front of you?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Do we agree that this is another
13 tweet that you posted to the Observer Mission's
14 Twitter account?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. Do we agree that this is a tweet
17 that you posted at 9:00 a.m., on April 12,
18 2020, as stated at the bottom of the tweet?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. And this is actually a retweet; is
21 that right?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. And you were retweeting on behalf of
24 the Observer Mission, to the Observer Mission's
25 Twitter account, a tweet that had originally

1 been posted by the PLO Department of Public
2 Diplomacy and Policy; correct?

3 A. Correct. Yes.

4 Q. And this is another communication by
5 the PLO relating to annexation of land in the
6 West Bank; is that correct?

7 MR. BERGER: Object to the
8 form of the question.

9 BY MR. SINAIKO:

10 Q. You may answer.

11 A. It appears so. I can't read all of
12 it, but I believe it was a statement put out by
13 Dr. Ashrawi regarding annexation.

14 Q. Okay. And that was something that
15 you felt the Observer Mission should
16 disseminate on Twitter; correct?

17 A. Absolutely. Annexation is one of
18 the biggest illegal moves that speaks against
19 everything that you can possibly read in the UN
20 charter regarding the illegal occupation of the
21 State of Palestine.

22 Q. Would it be fair to say that you
23 felt it was important to raise public awareness
24 on this issue by making this Twitter post?

25 A. Yes.

1 MR. SINAIKO: Let's go to Tab
2 22, which we are going to mark as Exhibit 9.

3 (Deposition Exhibit No. 9 was
4 marked for identification.)

5 BY MR. SINAIKO:

6 Q. And Ms. Ghannam, do you have Exhibit
7 9 in front of you?

8 A. I do.

9 Q. And do you recognize this to be a
10 retweet that you made to the Observer Mission's
11 Twitter account on April 28, 2020, at 6:30
12 p.m.?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. Okay. And do you recognize this
15 also to be a retweet?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And what is it a retweet of?

18 A. It was posted by the Institute of
19 Middle East Understanding on, once again,
20 illegal settlements on Palestinian land that
21 the United Nations opposes, and there's several
22 resolutions that oppose it and it is deemed
23 illegal.

24 Therefore, I felt it was extremely
25 important, on behalf of our Mission to the

1 United Nations, to continue working under the
2 mandate of the UN by elevating the illegal
3 issue of settlement expansion.

4 Q. When you say elevating the illegal
5 issue of expansion, you mean raising public
6 awareness on that topic by disseminating --

7 A. Correct.

8 Q. To bring attention?

9 A. Correct.

10 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. Let's go
11 to Tab 23, and I think we are on Exhibit 10.

12 (Deposition Exhibit No. 10 was
13 marked for identification.)

14 BY MR. SINAIKO:

15 Q. Ms. Ghannam, can you see Deposition
16 Exhibit 10 on the screen in front of you?

17 A. Not yet.

18 Q. I think we may be having another
19 technical problem. It looks like the video is
20 frozen. Can you hear me?

21 A. I can hear you, yes.

22 Q. Can you see Exhibit 10 on the screen
23 in front of you?

24 A. No.

25 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. We

1 definitely are having a technical problem
2 because I, in my Zoom, I can see Exhibit 10 on
3 the screen in front of me, but I think Ms.
4 Ghannam is unable to see it. And we need to
5 resolve that.

6 MR. BERGER: Let me see if I
7 can show her on my laptop, if that will solve
8 the problem.

9 THE WITNESS: Yes, I can see
10 this.

11 MR. SINAIKO: Great.
12 Actually, mine is working again. Okay.

13 BY MR. SINAIKO:

14 Q. Do you recognize this to be a tweet
15 that you posted to the Observer Mission's
16 Twitter account?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. And when did you make this Twitter
19 post?

20 A. It looks like May 11 at 3:03 p.m.

21 Q. Do you know where you were -- I
22 mean, do you know where you were physically
23 located at the time you made this Twitter post?

24 A. May 11th, I was in Washington.

25 Q. Okay. And the purpose of this

1 Twitter post was to raise public awareness of
2 Israeli annexation threat; is that correct?

3 A. Yes.

4 MR. SINAIKO: Let's go to Tab
5 40. That will be Exhibit 11.

6 (Deposition Exhibit No. 11 was
7 marked for identification.)

8 BY MR. SINAIKO:

9 Q. Ms. Ghannam, can you see Deposition
10 Exhibit 11 in front of you?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. And can you tell me what you
13 recognize that document to be, if anything?

14 A. Yes. I believe it speaks to the
15 illegal annexation policy by the occupying
16 Tala (phonetic).

17 Q. Okay. And, more generally, you
18 recognize this to be a Twitter post on the
19 Observer Mission's Twitter feed; correct?

20 A. That is correct.

21 Q. And it's actually another retweet;
22 is that right?

23 A. That is correct.

24 Q. And what is it a retweet of?

25 A. It discusses 18 Senate Democrats, I

1 tagged them, expressing their concern regarding
2 unilateral annexation of Palestinian territory.

3 Q. And who made the original post?

4 A. It looks like -- oh, the original
5 post, excuse me, the PLO Department of Public
6 Diplomacy and Policy.

7 Q. Right. And that's an entity that is
8 part of one of the Defendants in this case;
9 correct?

10 A. I -- Public Diplomacy and Policy is
11 an extension of the type of work that the PLO
12 does, I suppose. I don't know whether or not
13 they are Defendants in this case or not, to be
14 quite frank with you. I just know from a media
15 standpoint, without --

16 Q. Let me put the question again.

17 Do you understand that the PLO
18 Department of Public Diplomacy and Policy is
19 part of the Palestine Liberation Organization,
20 one of the Defendants in this case?

21 MR. BERGER: Objection, calls
22 for a legal conclusion, but you can answer
23 again.

24 THE WITNESS: They are part of
25 the PLO, yes.

1 BY MR. SINAIKO:

2 Q. Okay. And you posted this -- well,
3 withdrawn.

4 Is it correct that you retweeted, on
5 the Observer Mission's Twitter account, the
6 original Twitter posts from the PLO Department
7 of Public Diplomacy and Policy to call
8 attention to the fact that members of the
9 United States Congress had expressed concerns
10 about annexation?

11 A. Because the United Nations is
12 encompassing, the United States is part of the
13 United Nations. Therefore, it becomes another
14 issue, when we talk about unilateral annexation
15 of Palestinian territory, the United States is
16 a member of the UN. Hence, this falls within
17 the frame of my work.

18 I am doing work on behalf of the
19 United Nations since the U.S. is a member of
20 the UN.

21 MR. SINAIKO: All right.
22 Let's go to Tab 41. I think this is going to
23 be 12. So let's mark the next document that
24 pops up as Exhibit 12.

25 (Deposition Exhibit No. 12 was

1 marked for identification.)

2 BY MR. SINAIKO:

3 Q. And Ms. Ghannam, can you see Exhibit
4 12 in front of you?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And what do you recognize that to
7 be?

8 A. A tweet, it looks -- just a tweet
9 regarding, it's watch now, which looks like
10 it's a video.

11 Q. Right. So this is a Twitter post
12 that you put on the Observer Mission's Twitter
13 feed on July 29 of 2020; correct?

14 A. Correct.

15 Q. And the purpose of this Twitter was
16 to encourage the public to watch the video that
17 was attached to the tweet; is that right?

18 A. Correct.

19 Q. And the video was prepared by the
20 PLO Department of Public Diplomacy and Policy;
21 correct?

22 A. It was prepared by them to highlight
23 the illegal annexation and the illegal
24 occupation of Palestinian territory, which are
25 considered crimes against humanity by the

1 United Nations, correct.

2 Q. Right. So the question was, this
3 was -- the question was, this is a video that
4 was prepared by the PLO Department of Public
5 Diplomacy and Policy; correct?

6 A. Correct.

7 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. Let's
8 mark -- let's put up Tab 24, which we will mark
9 as Exhibit 13.

10 (Deposition Exhibit No. 13 was
11 marked for identification.)

12 BY MR. SINAIKO:

13 Q. Ms. Ghannam, do you have Exhibit 13
14 in front of you?

15 A. I do see it, yes.

16 Q. And what do you recognize this
17 document to be?

18 A. It's something written against the
19 illegal use of administrative detention,
20 Palestinian prisoners.

21 Q. So let me just ask the question in a
22 little bit more focused way. Do you recognize
23 this to be a tweet that you posted to the
24 Observer Mission's Twitter feed?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. And when did you make this post to
2 the Observer Mission's Twitter feed?

3 A. It looks like October 6, 2020, at
4 1:00 p.m.

5 Q. And this was also a retweet; is that
6 right?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. And it was a retweet of a tweet
9 originally posted by the PLO Department of
10 Public Diplomacy and Policy; correct?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Okay. And the topic of this -- the
13 topic of this tweet was administrative
14 detention; is that right?

15 A. Yes. Illegal administrative
16 detention, correct.

17 Q. Understood. And the purpose of this
18 tweet was to elevate public awareness of
19 illegal -- pardon me -- administrative
20 detention; is that correct?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. That was -- right. Okay.

23 A. Yes. Because many people don't
24 understand what administrative detention is.

25 Q. Understood.

1 MR. SINAIKO: So let's go to
2 Tab 25, which we will mark as Exhibit 14.

3 (Deposition Exhibit No. 14 was
4 marked for identification.)

5 BY MR. SINAIKO:

6 Q. Ms. Ghannam, can you see Exhibit 14
7 in front of you?

8 A. Most of it. Your face and my face
9 block off the right side of it.

10 Q. Let's fix it so that you can see --
11 I want to do whatever -- can you see it better
12 now?

13 A. That works.

14 Q. All righty. So can you see the
15 document now?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And can you tell me whether that's a
18 tweet that you posted to the Observer Mission's
19 Twitter feed?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. And when did you make this posting
22 to the Observer Mission's Twitter feed?

23 A. November 28, 2020, at 2:27 p.m.

24 Q. By any chance, do you know where you
25 were located physically when you made that

1 posting?

2 A. Thanksgiving, that first year, after
3 COVID -- I believe we were in Washington.

4 Q. But you weren't in the Observer
5 Mission building?

6 A. No.

7 Q. Okay. And the purpose of -- would
8 it be fair to say that the purpose of this
9 tweet was to call public attention to a letter
10 that Dr. Mansour wrote to a UN official?

11 A. Well, I can't see the original
12 letter, but either Dr. Riyad would have written
13 it or Ambassador Feda would have written it, if
14 Dr. Riyad was out of town.

15 Q. Let's go to the attachment because
16 that's part of the exhibit.

17 A. Okay.

18 Q. Let me just ask the question again.
19 Do you see that the document referenced in the
20 Twitter post is a letter that --

21 A. A letter by --

22 Q. I'm sorry?

23 A. You would have to scroll all the way
24 to the bottom to see who it was written by.

25 Q. Certainly. Let's do that so you get

1 to see it.

2 A. Go up a little more, please. I
3 don't know who drafted it. It was either
4 Ambassador Feda or Dr. Riyad. But most
5 likely --

6 Q. Let's go down to the bottom of the
7 letter for just a moment. You will see that it
8 appears to be signed by Dr. Khalil El-Halabi.
9 Do you see that?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Do you understand this to be a
12 letter that Dr. Khalil El-Halabi wrote to a UN
13 official or to -- or perhaps to, you know,
14 Ambassador Mansour?

15 A. It could be -- it could have been
16 that he was quoted in the letter. I didn't
17 write the letter. I just posted it.

18 Q. Okay. The purpose of the Twitter
19 post was to disseminate this letter publicly to
20 draw attention to the issue -- raise public
21 attention to the issue raised in the letter;
22 correct?

23 A. Yes.

24 MR. SINAIKO: Let's go to Tab
25 26, which we will mark as Exhibit 15.

1 (Deposition Exhibit No. 15 was
2 marked for identification.)

3 BY MR. SINAIKO:

4 Q. Ms. Ghannam, do you have Exhibit 15
5 in front of you?

6 A. I do.

7 Q. Do you recognize this to be another
8 post that you put on the Observer Mission's
9 Twitter feed?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. And when did you put this post on
12 the Observer Mission's Twitter feed?

13 A. January 11, 2021 at 9:16 a.m.

14 Q. And it says, on the top of the first
15 line, statement by PMOFA. Do you see that?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. What is PMOFA?

18 A. The Palestinian Ministry of Foreign
19 Affairs.

20 Q. So this was a tweet by which the
21 Observer Mission was disseminating a message
22 created by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs;
23 correct?

24 A. This is correct.

25 Q. And the Ministry of Foreign Affairs,

1 that is -- or the statement by the Ministry of
2 Foreign Affairs, pardon me, is that the
3 document attached at the bottom of the tweet?

4 A. Yes. I believe -- I believe it's
5 actually a media brief drafted by NAD, the
6 Negotiation Affairs Department.

7 Q. And it's the PLO -- that's the
8 Palestine Liberation Organization Negotiation
9 Affairs Department; correct?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. And is that part of the Ministry of
12 Foreign Affairs?

13 A. No.

14 Q. What is the connection between the
15 Negotiation Affairs Department and the Ministry
16 of Foreign Affairs, if any?

17 A. I don't know the exact legal
18 connection between the two. My specialty is
19 not in that realm of work.

20 My work was to just disseminate the
21 information as it pertains to the illegality of
22 the State of Israel's illegal occupation of
23 Palestinians as a violation of Fourth Geneva
24 Convention, as a violation of the UN mandate,
25 as a violation of the UN charter, that they

1 have to take full responsibility of its
2 citizens of the occupying -- the occupying
3 power has to take full responsibility of the
4 citizens it is occupying; hence, the reason for
5 the information regarding the lack of COVID
6 vaccinations to the occupied people.

7 Q. Okay. So the purpose of this post
8 was to elevate public awareness of the issue
9 that was being raised in this paper prepared by
10 the Palestine Liberation Organization
11 Negotiation Affairs Department; is that
12 correct?

13 MR. BERGER: Objection, asked
14 and answered. You may answer again. You may
15 answer again.

16 THE WITNESS: Yes, because,
17 again, if you note, at the end, I write the
18 full statement below at UN, which means I
19 publicly retweet back to the United Nations
20 that what I am stating is a complete violation
21 of the UN mandate, of the UN charter.

22 And, therefore, it is the occupying
23 power's obligation to administer vaccines,
24 vaccinations to the occupyees, so they are in
25 violation of international law and it is

1 illegal what they are doing to the occupied
2 people of Palestine.

3 BY MR. SINAIKO:

4 Q. So would it be fair to say that the
5 purpose of this tweet is to draw to public
6 attention conduct that the Observer Mission
7 regards as a violation of UN requirements?

8 A. Yes.

9 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. Let's go
10 to Tab 27. That will be Exhibit 16.

11 (Deposition Exhibit No. 16 was
12 marked for identification.)

13 BY MR. SINAIKO:

14 Q. And Ms. Ghannam, can you see Exhibit
15 16? I think the video might be frozen again so
16 I'm not sure you can see it.

17 A. Not yet.

18 MR. SINAIKO: Let's give it a
19 moment and if it doesn't -- if it doesn't pop
20 up, Mitch, maybe we can show her the document
21 on your laptop.

22 MR. BERGER: It's popping up.

23 THE WITNESS: Okay. Yes, I
24 remember this.

25 BY MR. SINAIKO:

1 Q. Maybe you can start by telling us,
2 in a high level way, whether this is yet
3 another tweet that you posted to the Observer
4 Mission's Twitter account?

5 A. Yes, I did.

6 Q. Okay. And this was done on February
7 14, 2021; correct?

8 A. Correct.

9 Q. Okay. And what exactly was this
10 Twitter, tweet -- let me withdraw that.

11 What exactly was this tweet
12 disseminating?

13 A. Why was it disseminated; is that
14 your question?

15 Q. I was asking what was being
16 disseminated through this tweet.

17 A. Oh. It was stories of the
18 illegality of the Israeli citizenship law which
19 forces citizens to stay away from each other
20 because of the illegal occupation.

21 Q. Okay. And the purpose of this tweet
22 was to draw public attention to an Israeli law
23 that the Observer Mission --

24 A. An illegal Israeli law --

25 Q. Let me finish the question. Am I

1 correct that the purpose of this tweet was to
2 draw attention to an Israeli law that the
3 Observer Mission regarded as inconsistent with
4 UN mandates?

5 A. Yes.

6 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. Let's go
7 to Tab 28, which we will mark as Exhibit 17.

8 (Deposition Exhibit No. 17 was
9 marked for identification.)

10 BY MR. SINAIKO:

11 Q. All right. Ms. Ghannam, are you
12 able to see Exhibit 17?

13 A. Not yet.

14 Q. Okay. Would you let me know when it
15 pops up?

16 A. Okay.

17 Q. This is so much easier in person, I
18 have to tell you.

19 MR. BERGER: I've got it on my
20 laptop, so let me show it to you. Can you see
21 it from here? There you go. It's on the big
22 screen now.

23 THE WITNESS: Okay.

24 BY MR. SINAIKO:

25 Q. Do you recognize this to be another

1 tweet that you posted to the Observer Mission's
2 Twitter account?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. And it's a tweet that you posted on
5 May 11; correct?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. And this is a tweet -- what was the
8 nature of this tweet? Maybe you can tell us
9 that. I'll try to ask it in a more open-ended
10 way.

11 A. Sure. So a Mark Ruffalo, which many
12 of you know is a celebrity, used his platform
13 to expose the illegality of the potential
14 expulsion of 1500 Palestinians from occupied
15 Jerusalem.

16 Q. And in this tweet, the Observer
17 Mission thanked Mr. Ruffalo for making his
18 post; is that correct?

19 A. Yes, I did.

20 Q. Okay. Let's go to the next page of
21 this one. Is that Mr. Ruffalo's post that you
22 were forwarding?

23 A. I believe I was retweeting it, yes.

24 Q. Okay. And you see that
25 Mr. Ruffalo's post, in turn, attached a

1 document?

2 A. Although. Would you mind going back
3 for a second, because I think --

4 Q. Not at all.

5 A. -- I might have just retweeted.
6 Okay. I'm sorry, go ahead. Uh-huh.

7 Q. Do you see that Mr. Ruffalo's tweet
8 that the Observer Mission retweeted to its own
9 Twitter account, in turn, attached the
10 document?

11 A. I may not have noticed it at the
12 time. I don't recall right now. There was a
13 lot going on during this time period.

14 Q. Understood. But you see that there
15 is a document attached to Mr. Ruffalo's tweet;
16 correct?

17 A. I do see that.

18 Q. And do you understand what that
19 document is?

20 A. You'd have to open it for me to look
21 at it. I don't recall.

22 Q. Let's go to the next page.

23 A. Okay.

24 Q. Do you understand what that might
25 be?

1 A. No.

2 Q. Do you want to -- do you need --
3 maybe we should show her the rest of the pages
4 of it.

5 A. Assuming it's some sort of petition.

6 Q. Okay. Right. So Mr. Ruffalo's
7 tweet -- well, Mr. Ruffalo's tweet attached a
8 petition that members of the public could sign
9 relating to this topic; correct?

10 A. It appears so.

11 Q. And the Observer Mission retweeted
12 Mr. Ruffalo's tweet to bring Mr. Ruffalo's
13 tweet to the attention of a broader audience;
14 correct?

15 A. Yes.

16 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. Let's go
17 to Tab 29, which will be Exhibit 18.

18 (Deposition Exhibit No. 18 was
19 marked for identification.)

20 BY MR. SINAIKO:

21 Q. Okay. We're going to be on Tab 29.
22 That will be Exhibit 18.

23 Mr. Ghannam, if you can just let me
24 know when you are able to see that.

25 MR. BERGER: I'll show it to

1 her on my laptop.

2 MR. SINAIKO: I've got to say,
3 I can't wait until we're able to do these
4 things in person again. This is just
5 incredibly painful.

6 MR. BERGER: She's got it on
7 my laptop for now, until it pops up on the big
8 screen.

9 BY MR. SINAIKO:

10 Q. So Ms. Ghannam, can you see
11 Deposition Exhibit 18 now?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And this is another tweet that you
14 posted to the Observer Mission's Twitter
15 account; is that correct?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And you made that post on May 15,
18 2021; is that correct?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. There, now you can see it on the big
21 screen. Once your video pops up, I know you
22 can see it.

23 So you've got it on the screen in
24 front of you now?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. Was this -- I see that this one,
2 this tweet actually has the SaveSheikhJarrah
3 hashtag; do you see that?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. Would it be fair to say that part of
6 the purpose of that hashtag was to magnify the
7 attention, the public attention that this
8 Twitter posting would receive?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. Okay. And the purpose of this --
11 well, what was the document? It looks like
12 there's a document attached to this tweet, is
13 that right, or maybe this is retweeting?

14 A. Retweeting, from what I can recall.
15 I don't know if that's a video or just a
16 picture. If I have to guess, it's just a
17 picture because what happened is that the
18 occupying power indiscriminately and illegally
19 bombed and destroyed the offices of the
20 Associated Press and Al Jazeera Arabic in Gaza
21 and, therefore, the occupied region of Gaza was
22 cut off from the rest of the world, so we had
23 to rely on tweets coming out from the region to
24 show the world what was happening illegally
25 there.

1 Q. So would it be fair to say that the
2 purpose of this tweet was to call public
3 attention to the Observer Mission's view that
4 Israel had indiscriminately and illegally
5 bombed and destroyed the offices of the
6 Associated Press in Al Jazeera?

7 A. The purpose of this tweet is to
8 highlight the view of the State of Palestine
9 and the United Nations in terms of the
10 illegality of what Israel was doing in terms of
11 conducting potential war crimes against nearly
12 two million people who are subjected to an
13 illegal blockade of nearly 14 years, which is
14 deemed illegal by the United Nations, yes.

15 All of this falls within my
16 framework at the UN because all of these issues
17 and everything that you have asked me thus far
18 are things that the UN discusses regularly as
19 illegal and against the UN charter and the UN
20 framework.

21 Q. I notice -- I notice, Ms. Ghannam,
22 that the first line of this tweet references
23 @POTUS. Do you see that?

24 A. Yes, the President of the United
25 States.

1 Q. And why would this tweet make
2 reference to the President of the United
3 States?

4 A. Because the United States of America
5 is a permanent member of the UN Security
6 Council, and the United States, as a permanent
7 member of the Security Council, regularly votes
8 against any and all resolutions that speak
9 against the illegal occupation of the State of
10 Palestine.

11 So while the whole world watches
12 this indiscriminate bombing of this illegal
13 occupation, the United States happens to be the
14 only member of the Security Council that cannot
15 publicly make a statement saying that this is
16 wrong.

17 Q. And you wanted to -- is it true,
18 Ms. Ghannam, would it be fair to say,
19 Ms. Ghannam, that one of the purposes of this
20 tweet was to raise awareness of the positions
21 that the Trump administration was taking within
22 the United States?

23 A. My purpose was to bring forth the
24 policies that the United Nations as a voting
25 member of the -- excuse me, the United States,

1 as a voting member of the United Nations and as
2 a permanent member of the United Nations
3 Security Council and their extremely important
4 role at the United Nations, and how are they
5 able to sit back and take a side seat to an
6 issue distressing to many people around the
7 world, an issue that's illegal.

8 Q. Was part of the purpose of this
9 tweet to raise awareness among the American
10 public of the position that its government was
11 taking?

12 MR. BERGER: Objection, asked
13 and answered. You may answer again.

14 BY MR. SINAIKO:

15 Q. You may answer.

16 A. The objection was to raise awareness
17 that the United States of America, which is a
18 voting member of the Security Council of the
19 United Nations, and a permanent member of the
20 United Nations security member, and the fact
21 that all work conducted in the region, gets the
22 blessing of the United States, through the
23 United Nations, and, therefore, the fact that
24 the United States of America is unable to make
25 a public statement regarding something where

1 the majority of the world was able to demonize
2 in one way or another was perplexing, yes.

3 Q. Okay. Just going to try one more
4 time. The objective was to raise that
5 awareness among the American public; is that
6 correct?

7 MR. BERGER: Objection. It's
8 not only asked and answered, but the reason why
9 you keep coming back is that it's
10 argumentative. So I object to the
11 argumentative questioning of this witness.

12 MR. SINAIKO: She can answer
13 the question.

14 MR. BERGER: Do you have
15 anything to add to your previous answer?

16 THE WITNESS: No.

17 MR. SINAIKO: She can answer
18 the question that I ask, not the questions that
19 you ask, Mr. Berger.

20 MR. BERGER: You've asked this
21 question three times. It's argumentative,
22 asked and answered. You may answer it again.

23 MR. SINAIKO: I would like the
24 question read back please, Karen.

25 (Reporter read back from the

1 record.)

2 THE WITNESS: No.

3 MR. SINAIKO: Let's mark as
4 our next exhibit Tab 30. I think this will be
5 Exhibit 19.

6 (Deposition Exhibit No. 19 was
7 marked for identification.)

8 BY MR. SINAIKO:

9 Q. Ms. Ghannam, can you see Exhibit 19
10 in front of you?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Okay. And you recognize -- what do
13 you recognize this to be, if anything?

14 A. I recognize this very well. It was
15 a mother and a child who were stuck under the
16 rubble of their house after it being illegally
17 shelled and begging for help so that they were
18 not to die.

19 Q. This was a Twitter post that was put
20 on -- that you put on the Observer Mission's
21 Twitter feed; correct?

22 A. Absolutely correct.

23 Q. And the topic was the one that you
24 just mentioned; correct?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. And the purpose of this Twitter feed
2 was to raise public awareness about the conduct
3 that is described in this Twitter post and the
4 Observer Mission's position with respect to
5 that conduct; correct?

6 A. Yes.

7 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. Let's go
8 to Tab 31, which we will mark as Exhibit 20.

9 (Deposition Exhibit No. 20 was
10 marked for identification.)

11 BY MR. SINAIKO:

12 Q. Do you see Deposition Exhibit 20 on
13 the screen?

14 A. No. Yes, now I do.

15 Q. And do you recognize that to be
16 another tweet that you posted to the Observer
17 Mission's Twitter account on May 17, 2021?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Okay. And do you see that this
20 Twitter post makes reference to AOC?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Who is that?

23 A. Alexandria Ortez -- I always forget
24 her name. The representative from New York.

25 Q. Right. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez; is

1 that right?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And what about Bush?

4 A. Yes. Cori Bush.

5 Q. And what about --

6 A. John Oliver.

7 Q. Uh-huh, who else?

8 A. Ali Velshi, and then Reid, I forget
9 his first name, yes.

10 Q. And what information was this
11 Twitter post conveying?

12 A. That the use of the word "apartheid"
13 is not so illegal, it's not deemed as taboo
14 anymore.

15 Q. Okay. And the purpose of -- the
16 purpose of this, is it correct that the purpose
17 of this tweet was to disseminate publicly the
18 Observer Mission's view that the State of
19 Israel engages in apartheid?

20 A. The purpose of this tweet is to
21 share information that is left up to the
22 general public to decipher in any way possible
23 that they see fit in terms of the illegalities
24 of what is happening to the people of Palestine
25 that is repeatedly discussed and repeated at

1 the United Nations.

2 It is not up to me to decide what
3 people take from what I post.

4 MR. SINAIKO: Okay. Let's put
5 up Tab 32 and let's mark that as our next
6 exhibit, which will be Exhibit 21.

7 (Deposition Exhibit No. 21 was
8 marked for identification.)

9 BY MR. SINAIKO:

10 Q. Ms. Ghannam, can you see Exhibit 21?

11 A. Not yet.

12 MR. BERGER: Every time I show
13 her my laptop, it pops on the video.

14 MR. SINAIKO: It's like
15 clockwork.

16 (Off-the-record discussion
17 held.)

18 BY MR. SINAIKO:

19 Q. Okay. Can you see the document now,
20 Exhibit 21?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. And that's another posting that you
23 made to the Observer Mission's Twitter account?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. And that was a retweet?

18 agreement is needed to see a just and viable
19 peace in the region, something that the United
20 Nations had been working towards for decades
21 now and is the longest standing occupation and
22 file at the United Nations.

24 to Tab 33, which we will mark as Exhibit 22.

25 (Deposition Exhibit No. 22 was

1 marked for identification.)

2 MR. SINAIKO: And Mitch, if
3 you could just put the laptop in front of her
4 now so that this works more promptly this time.

5 MR. BERGER: Yeah. I don't
6 have it yet. See, it worked instantly.

7 MR. SINAIKO: Like magic.

13 recognize -- can you see Deposition Exhibit 23

morning, everyone. We are now on the record. Participants should be aware that this proceeding is being recorded and, as such, all conversations held will be recorded unless there is a request and agreement to go off the record.

This is the remote video-recorded deposition of Riyadh Mansour. Today is Thursday, July 8, 2021. The time is now 13:32 UTC time.

We are here in the matter of Shatsky versus PLO. My name is Corey Wainaina, remote video technician on behalf of US Legal Support located at 90 Broad Street, New York, New York.

I am not related to any party in this action, nor am I financially interested in the outcome. At this time, will the reporter, Karen Nickel, on behalf of US Legal Support, please enter the statement for remote proceedings into the record?

THE REPORTER: The attorneys participating in this deposition acknowledge that I am not physically present in the

1 deposition room and that I will be reporting
2 this deposition remotely.

3 They further acknowledge that, in
4 lieu of an oath administered in person, the
5 witness will verbally declare his testimony in
6 this matter is under penalty of perjury.

8 consent to this arrangement and waive any

12 Q. Did you meet with any other lawyers?

13 A. Early in the process, yes, but the
14 -- for this deposition is with Mitch.

15 Q. By "early in the process," do you
16 mean at the beginning of the lawsuit?

17 A. No. When we were approached to make
18 deposition.

19 Q. And, approximately, how long ago was
20 that?

21 A. A month, month and a half ago.

22 Q. And at that time, who did you meet
23 with?

24 A. I think Mitch can -- I don't
25 remember the names, Mitch can remember them.

1 One, Baloul, I think, I believe, his last name.

2 The other one I don't remember.

3 Q. Mr. Baloul?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. And there was another attorney as
6 well?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. Was it Mr. Alonzo?

9 A. I don't remember the name.

10 Q. Fair enough. And when you reviewed
11 your calendar entries that were provided to us
12 in preparing for your deposition, did those
13 documents refresh your memory at all as to any
14 events?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. Specifically, did they refresh your
17 memory as to the events in question on the
18 calendar?

19 A. Calendar is very basic as to
20 hundreds of meetings. So it refreshed my
21 memory as to which meeting, with whom, so that
22 I remember, you know, these sort of -- to
23 refresh my memory about these things, yes.

24 Q. And did you bring any documents with
25 you to the deposition today?

1 A. No. Other than the two documents
2 that I have here.

3 Q. What are the two documents that you
4 have there?

5 A. These two documents. This one, this
6 one.

7 Q. Okay. It appears to me that you are
8 showing me the copy of your calendar entries
9 and a copy of the Defendants' revised privilege
10 log?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Is that correct?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. Okay. I would like to just step
15 back for just a moment and do a quick
16 housekeeping measure. I understand that
17 Ms. Nickel is in Pennsylvania. Dr. Mansour,
18 where are you today?

19 A. In my office in New York, 115 East
20 65th Street, New York, New York.

21 Q. So you are in the Observer Mission
22 building?

23 A. Yes.

24 MR. WICK: I just want to be
25 clear that we are all in agreement, per Rule 29

1 MR. BERGER: Ron, I really
2 don't know what you mean by "the general
3 nature." You have asked a question about
4 whether something is a staff meeting. That is
5 perfectly acceptable to us. If you are asking
6 about what the topics were that were discussed
7 at the staff meeting, that is covered by
8 functional immunity.

9 BY MR. WICK:

10 Q. I'm going move down to the, about
11 two-thirds of the way down that first page,
12 there is an entry dated February 2, 2020 and
13 the subject line is interactions with civil
14 society organization Beit Hanina Cultural
15 Center Brooklyn on UN topics. Do you see that
16 entry?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Where did that event take place?

19 A. In Brooklyn.

20 Q. I apologize if I am mispronouncing
21 this. What is the Beit Hanina Cultural Center?

22 A. Civil society organization.

23 Q. What do you mean by a civil society
24 organization?

25 A. It is a civil society organization

1 of the community, Palestinian-Americans, who
2 were originally from Beit Hanina, which is a
3 neighborhood in Jerusalem, who are residing in
4 Brooklyn.

5 Q. And what is the purpose of the
6 organization?

7 A. I don't really know. You have to
8 ask, you know, the organizers of this
9 organization. They are better qualified --

10 Q. To your knowledge, does the Beit
11 Hanina Cultural Center have any connection to
12 the United Nations?

13 A. So the work of the United Nations,
14 many people might not know that it is not only
15 diplomats, it is diplomats' involvement of
16 civil society organization, involvement of the
17 media, involvement of the missions, involvement
18 of parliamentarians, involvement of so many
19 sectors of different societies, because the way
20 the UN operates, it invites so many different
21 representations of different societies and
22 countries that participate in the decision
23 making process.

24 So, therefore, there are hundreds,
25 maybe more than hundreds, civil society

1 organizations that are accredited to the United
2 Nations or --

3 THE COURT REPORTER: Excuse
4 me, please.

5 The videographer, is there some way
6 of correcting the audio between the witness and
7 Mr. Berger because I'm having trouble with the
8 witness cutting out and then Mr. Berger, when
9 he speaks, there is a lot of echoing on my end.

10 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are now
11 off the record. The time is 14:31 UTC time.

12 (Discussion held off the
13 record.)

14 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are
15 back on the record. The time is 14:36 UTC
16 time.

17 BY MR. WICK:

18 Q. Dr. Mansour, before we had to go off
19 the record, you were in the middle of an answer
20 to my question. I had asked you whether the
21 Beit Hanina Cultural Center had any connection
22 to the United Nations and you were explaining
23 that the United Nations involves multiple
24 organizations.

25 Is there anything more that you

1 wanted to say?

2 A. No. Just, basically, I was saying
3 the nature of work at the United Nations, it is
4 so encompassing and exclusive that it allows
5 for participation in the decisionmaking process
6 to so many different players; representatives
7 of countries, representatives of multicultural
8 organizations, civil society organizations,
9 media, parliamentarians, all components of
10 society because the agenda of the UN, it
11 involves humanity in so many different ways.

12 I will give an example. For
13 example, when we debate climate change, that is
14 not only the domain of diplomats, it is civil
15 society admissions, activists, private sectors,
16 all of them, they have a stake on this issue.

17 And the UN and the Secretary General
18 and the General Assembly invite all those to
19 contribute to that collective effort of all of
20 us of how we view these issues and what we
21 legislate.

22 So, therefore, everybody has
23 something to contribute. So in this example,
24 this civil society organization, the
25 Palestinian-Americans, they feel that they have

1 a role to influence those who are dealing with
2 the question of Palestine at the UN with
3 whatever they have in their mind.

4 Q. Does the Beit Hanina Cultural Center
5 have any accreditation from the United Nations?

6 A. As far as I know, I don't really
7 know. They may, they may not. I will just
8 give an example. There are hundreds who are
9 accredited civil society organizations. Some
10 of them are Palestinian, some of them are
11 Palestinian-American. Many of them are
12 Jewish-American organization or Israeli
13 organization.

14 Some of them, they go through the
15 scrutiny of the Social and Economic Council to
16 approve them as accredited civil society
17 organization, who may be on the Exercise of the
18 Inalienable Rights has its own mechanism of
19 accrediting civil society organization, and
20 there are hundreds of them that are accredited
21 by that group. I am just giving you an example
22 how things are at the United Nations, not only
23 diplomats operating in a vacuum. We operate
24 within the dynamics of what is happening, all
25 of us.

1 Q. I understand that. To be clear, you
2 don't know whether the Beit Hanina Cultural
3 Center is accredited by the United Nations;
4 correct?

5 A. I don't know.

6 Q. And what does it mean for a civil
7 society organization to be accredited by the
8 United Nations?

9 A. To be invited --

10 THE COURT REPORTER: I'm
11 sorry, I did not hear the ending.

12 THE WITNESS: To be
13 accredited, to be invited to events. For
14 example, if you are an accredited women
15 organization, there are so many conferences and
16 events related to the rights of women. So then
17 if you are accredited, you will be invited, you
18 will listen to debates, you can contribute to
19 debates, you can lobby for certain kind of
20 resolutions and you are allowed to vote on
21 these things, as an example.

22 MR. WICK: Let me put up Tab
23 16, please. I am going to ask that this
24 document be marked as next in order, I believe
25 Exhibit 5.

1 A. No.

2 Q. Did he have any connection to the
3 United Nations at the time of this interaction?

4 A. I think that, in general, everything
5 that he does is related to the work of the
6 United Nations, particularly in the legal
7 field, in the international criminal court, and
8 the international court of justice. He is
9 highly involved in all these issues, or key
10 components of the work of the --

11 Q. But you're not aware of any formal
12 position or connection or accreditation between
13 Ardi and the United Nations as of the time of
14 this meeting; correct?

15 A. I don't know. I don't have any
16 knowledge.

17 Q. Where did this event take place?

18 A. I believe it is Zoom, because it's
19 Ramallah, New York. Michael Lynk is either in
20 Geneva or Canada, the same thing with Ardi.

21 Q. And where were you at the time of
22 the meeting?

23 A. Most likely in my office.

24 Q. And what was the substance of this
25 meeting?

1 A. Legal issues.

2 Q. Legal issue?

3 A. Legal issues, not one issue.

4 Q. Okay. Which legal issues?

5 I'm sorry, did you hear my question,
6 Dr. Mansour?

7 A. I did, I heard what -- Mitch is
8 advising me.

9 MR. WICK: If Mr. Berger is
10 speaking, we can't hear him.

11 MR. BERGER: I'm on double
12 mute. I thought I had my phone -- was off
13 mute, but my computer is on mute. I said I
14 object on grounds of functional immunity and
15 instruct the witness not to answer, because you
16 are getting into the substance of a meeting for
17 which we claim functional immunity.

18 MR. WICK: Even though the
19 witness has testified that there was an
20 individual present who has no known connection
21 or relationship with the United Nations?

22 MR. BERGER: Yes. As we
23 explained to you in a letter I sent to you
24 yesterday, functional immunity does not turn on
25 the presence or absence of somebody not with

1 the United Nations.

2 It turns, according to the UN
3 Secretariat, on whether the meeting occurred in
4 the exercise of the Observer's function. His
5 testimony confirms it did. So it's, therefore,
6 covered by functional immunity.

7 BY MR. WICK:

8 Q. Scroll down two more pages, please.
9 There is, about seven lines down, there is a
10 notation on November 24, 2020, interaction with
11 civil society organization Israa University on
12 UN topics.

13 Do you see that?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And where did that event take place?

16 A. It's a virtual event. I was in my
17 office, and Israa University is one of the
18 Palestine universities in the Gaza Strip.

19 Q. Was the event virtual?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. And you were in your office in the
22 Observer Mission?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. And what type of interaction was
25 this; was it a speech?

1 A. Yes, speech and questions and
2 answers.

3 Q. And was that speech open to the
4 public?

5 A. I don't know what they did in the
6 Gaza Strip. I just was speaking through, you
7 know, Zoom to a group of people, individuals
8 that appeared on -- as we are communicating.

9 Q. So you have no knowledge as to
10 whether or not the event was public or not
11 public?

12 A. I think it was a course, graduate
13 course related to media and UN issues related
14 to the question of Palestine.

15 Q. So were you a guest lecturer in the
16 class?

17 A. You can say that, yes.

18 Q. And were you compensated for that?

19 A. No.

20 Q. And to your knowledge, does Israa
21 University have any connection to the United
22 Nations?

23 A. I don't really know the connection
24 of that university but academia, in general,
25 are extremely interested in the UN. Many

1 universities, as you probably know, have UN
2 Model organizations teach students about the
3 work of the UN, agenda of the UN, and many
4 student groups, they like to represent in the
5 General Assembly format or Security Council
6 format, different countries. Very often when
7 they approach us, they want to represent
8 Palestine in these training sessions for
9 students.

10 Therefore, they ask us about all
11 kind of questions, what we do at the UN, the
12 topic, how we discuss them, so that they can
13 emulate representation of the State of
14 Palestine in their UN models.

15 Q. By the way, there are a number of
16 entries on the privilege log that use the
17 letters PR. For example, two lines above the
18 Israa University entry, it states, interaction
19 with PR of Norway.

20 Do you see that?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. What does PR stand for?

23 A. Permanent Representative. And you
24 know what my abbreviation is, PO.

25 Q. No.

1 A. PO.

2 Q. For Permanent Observer?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. Go over to the next page. Three

5 lines from the bottom, there is a note,

6 interaction with civil society organization

7 Coalition of Palestinian American Organizations

8 on UN topics. Again, February 28, 2021.

9 Do you see that?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. And where did that event take place?

12 A. It was a Zoom event.

13 Q. And where were you during that

14 event?

15 A. In my office.

16 Q. In your office where you are now?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. And were you giving a speech?

19 A. No. I was just listening because

20 the speaker was our Prime Minister,

21 Dr. Shtayyeh.

22 Q. Okay. And does, to your knowledge,

23 the Coalition of Palestinian American

24 Organizations have any connection to the United

25 Nations?

1 A. They might be accredited to the
2 United Nations.

3 Q. You have no knowledge as to whether
4 they are or they are not accredited?

5 A. No, I don't.

6 Q. And was the Prime Minister
7 discussing UN topics?

8 A. Everything is related to the UN when
9 you talk about peace, classes, two-state
10 solution, under the auspices of the United
11 Nation, the involvement of the Security
12 Council, in terms of reference to international
13 law and relevant --

14 THE COURT REPORTER: I'm
15 sorry, Doctor, you cut out again.

16 THE WITNESS: I said that in
17 his reference to the peace process, a just
18 solution to the conflict is the convening of
19 international peace conference under the
20 auspices of the Security Council, the
21 involvement of the Quartet of Peace in the
22 Middle East, under the banner of international
23 law and relevant UN resolutions, all these
24 things are issues related to United Nations.

25 BY MR. WICK:

1 Q. So in your view, any discussion of
2 peace in the Middle East is a UN topic?

3 A. At the UN, it is a UN topic. Peace
4 in the Middle East is a UN topic. It's a big
5 UN topic.

6 Q. Is climate change a UN topic?

7 A. Climate change is a UN topic, a big
8 UN topic.

9 Q. Is women's rights a UN topic?

10 A. Absolutely.

11 Q. So would it -- so it is your view
12 that any event that you attend that discusses
13 climate change or women's rights is official UN
14 business?

15 A. Yes. And I can add, for example,
16 climate change, we are a state party as the
17 State of Palestine to the climate change
18 convention. So we participate as equal with
19 all states as parties to the climate change
20 conference and the Paris Agreement on climate
21 change. We are equal.

22 The same thing, we are a party, as a
23 state party to so many conventions related to
24 the rights of women. They are equal with
25 everyone else. So we discuss these issues in

1 the general term and in the specific term as
2 related to Palestine.

3 It is like everybody else, we are
4 not different than anybody else. This is how
5 we do business at the UN.

6 Q. Can you think of any topic that is
7 not official UN -- that is not official UN
8 business in your view?

9 A. I am so busy in being submerged on
10 those, so many issues on the agenda of the UN
11 to the point that I don't think of other
12 issues.

13 Q. Would you consider the use of
14 plastics to be a UN topic?

15 A. In fact, it is. And I attended a
16 conference and event in one of the Caribbean
17 states with other officials, the Prime Minister
18 of that state, and normalizing for eliminating
19 plastic as a polluter against humanity and
20 affecting us in the negative way and polluters
21 of oceans and, you know, we were part of the
22 efforts to normalize humanity against plastic
23 things because they are, you know, negatively
24 affecting our environment.

25 And if you pass by the United

1 Nations, you will see big signs on the wall of
2 the United Nations for the public to see how
3 plastic is bad and eliminate plastic from use.

4 Q. So if you speak to an organization
5 at a non-public event about the use of
6 plastics, you would consider that part of your
7 organization's functional immunity?

8 A. If they invite me on my capacity as
9 Permanent Observer, Ambassador of the State of
10 Palestine, and in my capacity as a previous
11 chair of the Group of 77 and China, speak about
12 plastic and its negative effect on our
13 environment, that is within my exclusive domain
14 in exercising my authority as observership
15 activities as the Observer of the --

16 Q. Let's go to the next page, please.
17 On the next page, there is, about a third of
18 the way down, there's an entry dated March 26,
19 2021, interactions with civil society
20 organization church group on UN topics.

21 Do you see that?

22 A. March 20 what?

23 Q. 6.

24 A. 26. Yes.

25 Q. And where did that event take place?

1 A. It was virtual for a church group in
2 Orlando, Florida.

3 Q. Were you in your office at the
4 Observer Mission at the time?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. What was the name of the church
7 group?

8 A. My wife belongs to that group. I
9 cannot remember now the name, but it's a group
10 that she belongs to in Orlando, Florida.

11 Q. What was the nature of the group?

12 A. They are a group that work for peace
13 and justice in the Middle East.

14 Q. Okay. And does your wife's church
15 have any connection to the United Nations?

16 A. No, it doesn't. But I can, again,
17 tell you that faith-based organizations, almost
18 all churches in the United States and
19 worldwide, have Observers at the United
20 Nations. There is a building across the street
21 from the United Nations where there are so many
22 representatives from these different churches,
23 they represent them in the works of the General
24 Assembly, and they are a key player in so many
25 global issues in the agenda of the UN.

1 Q. Go to the next page. On June 30,
2 2020, middle of the page, there is an entry, it
3 simply says, interview (Zoom).

4 Do you see that?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And what was that event?

7 A. Most likely is, you know, a media
8 interview.

9 Q. Who was the media interview with?

10 A. I don't remember. It could be, you
11 know, the one after it. I don't really know,
12 to be precise.

13 Q. Okay. The next entry, which you
14 just referenced, is July 1, 2020. It says,
15 interview with TRT Arabic with Nihal. What
16 does that entry signify?

17 A. This is an interview that was done
18 from the TRT office in London, England.

19 Q. Was that done virtually?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. And where were you?

22 A. In the office, as far as I remember.

23 Q. In your office at the Observer
24 Mission?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. Then, on July 14, 2020, there is an
2 entry, virtual informal meeting of the General
3 Committee.

4 Do you see that?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. What is the General Committee?

7 A. The General Committee is a committee
8 of the General Assembly in which it deals with
9 the adoption of the agenda of the United
10 Nations. If any country wants to introduce a
11 new item on the agenda, they go to the General
12 Committee.

13 If the General Committee approves
14 the addition of that item, then the General
15 Assembly decides where to allocate that item,
16 whether in the General Assembly directly or one
17 of the major committees of the General
18 Assembly.

19 It relates to subject matter. If it
20 is an economic issue, they might decide to put
21 it on the agenda of the second. If it is a
22 disarmament issue, then they will put it in the
23 first. If it is a legal issue, they will put
24 it in the second, so that the General
25 Committee, that is the function of the General

1 Committee, to deal with the agenda of the
2 General Assembly.

3 Q. And that meeting relates to UN
4 business; correct?

5 A. Pardon me?

6 Q. That meeting related to United
7 Nations business; correct?

8 A. Absolutely.

9 Q. And you participated in that meeting
10 in your official capacity; correct?

11 A. I don't remember whether I went or I
12 had somebody else representing me there, but we
13 have, on the agenda of the United Nations, many
14 items related to us. So, therefore, we have
15 interest in the General Committee, yes.

16 Q. So you are not sure whether you
17 attended this meeting or not?

18 A. I'm not sure.

19 Q. Okay. Was this a non-public
20 meeting?

21 A. It is most likely a non-public
22 meeting, yes.

23 Q. And if you attended it, it would
24 have been in your official capacity as an
25 Observer --

1 A. Absolutely.

2 Q. And is there any reason in your mind
3 why the substance of that meeting wouldn't be
4 subject to functional immunity or privilege?

5 A. Can you repeat the question?

6 Q. Sure. Do you know of any reason why
7 the substance of this non-public meeting that
8 you attended in your official capacity as
9 Permanent Observer, that involved UN topics,
10 would not be privileged or subject to
11 functional immunity as some of the other items
12 we discussed were?

13 A. That meeting, definitely, everyone
14 who attended of the member states or Observer
15 states as in our case, is -- it applies to --
16 it is applies exactly to the General Assembly,
17 meaning all of us would be covered, you know,
18 under our headquarters agreement with United
19 States of America and the United Nations. All
20 of us would have immunity in that meeting
21 because it is in the United Nations --

22 Q. Do you know of any reason why this
23 item wasn't included on the privilege log?

24 A. No, I don't.

25 MR. BERGER: I can address

1 that and I want to put that on the record,
2 which is the very cover page of the calendar
3 says that it is subject to claims of functional
4 immunity and jurisdictional immunity. We put
5 it in the public calendar because it's listed
6 as a public event in the UN's public calendar.

7 MR. WICK: Thank you,
8 Mr. Berger.

9 BY MR. WICK:

10 Q. Let's go to the next page. There is
11 an entry, not quite halfway down, October 22,
12 2020, titled Zoom meeting with ADC. Do you see
13 that?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And do you know what that entry is
16 for?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. What was that event?

19 A. It was an event with ADC, which is
20 an accredited organization to the United
21 Nations, the Anti-Discrimination Committee,
22 about, you know, our work at the UN and
23 discussions with those who participated from
24 their side on this event. They invited me in
25 my official capacity as the Ambassador of the

1 State of Palestine, Permanent Observer to the
2 State of Palestine to the United Nations.

3 Q. We are going to show you a video
4 that we will have marked as Exhibit 7, please.

5 (Deposition Exhibit No. 7 was
6 marked for identification.)

7 (Video playing.)

8 BY MR. WICK:

9 Q. Dr. Mansour, do you recognize that
10 as a video of the ADC meeting described in your
11 October 22, 2020 calendar entry?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And where were you when you appeared
14 at --

15 A. In this office.

16 Q. At your office at the Observer
17 Mission?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. We can go back to the calendar.
20 What was the purpose of your appearance at the
21 ADC event, Dr. Mansour?

22 A. It's, you know, talking about what
23 we do at the United Nations, and whatever
24 questions that they have related to our work,
25 at that time, from the point of view of their

1 audience or those who are participating in that
2 event.

3 Q. Was one of those purposes to
4 advocate for the Palestinian cause?

5 A. I was invited in my capacity as the
6 Ambassador of the State of Palestine to the
7 United Nations, and it is my duty to exercise
8 my observership capacities at the United
9 Nations.

10 So it is within that context, I was
11 invited, and within that context, I shared with
12 them our view and vision.

13 Q. I'm going to ask the question again
14 because I don't think that I got a clear
15 answer.

16 Was one of your purposes in speaking
17 to the ADC to advocate for the Palestinian
18 cause?

19 A. I always advocate to the Palestinian
20 cause in my capacity as the Ambassador of the
21 State of Palestine to the United Nations in
22 carrying out my, and exercising my functions
23 and responsibilities as an Observer of the
24 United Nations.

25 Q. Just a moment, please. In the case

1 of the October 22, 2020 meeting, you were
2 advocating for the Palestinian cause to the
3 American Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee;
4 correct?

5 A. I was advocating in my capacity and
6 in my responsibility for those who were under
7 the other end of the Zoom.

8 Q. And that was members of the ADC;
9 correct?

10 A. I assume so. I don't know if they
11 are members or what.

12 Q. There is another entry on November
13 14, 2020, speak at the first convention of Beit
14 Sahour?

15 A. Sahour. Beit Sahour.

16 Q. Beit Sahour.

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. And what was that event?

19 A. This is another civil society
20 organization for Palestinian-Americans. I
21 believe it's in Michigan. And then they were
22 organizing themselves, building an
23 organization, and they invited me, in my
24 capacity as the Ambassador of the State of
25 Palestine to the United Nations, to say a few

1 words of congratulating them on the occasion of
2 their convention, and I shared with them what
3 we do at the United Nations.

4 Q. And we have another video to show
5 you, which we would like to mark as Exhibit 8.

6 (Deposition Exhibit No. 8 was
7 marked for identification.)

8 (Video playing.)

9 BY MR. WICK:

10 Q. Dr. Mansour, do you recognize that
11 as a video of the speech described on your
12 November 14, 2020 calendar entry?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. And you gave that speech virtually;
15 correct?

16 A. That is correct.

17 Q. And where were you when you gave the
18 speech?

19 A. In this office here.

20 Q. At the Observer Mission building?

21 A. That is correct.

22 MR. BERGER: May I please ask
23 for clarification of the record, which is,
24 you're showing very short clips of maybe eight
25 or ten seconds. When you're asking if he

1 recognizes them, I assume you're asking him if
2 he recognizes only the clips you're showing
3 him, because we haven't seen anything more than
4 that; is that correct?

5 MR. WICK: That is correct. I
6 am asking if he recognizes it as an excerpt
7 from the video.

8 MR. BERGER: But you are not
9 asking if he recognizes the remainder of the
10 video that you weren't showing him because you
11 haven't shown it to him and given him an
12 opportunity to comment on it. So I just want
13 to be clear, for the record, that his answers
14 are -- you're asking for answers that address
15 the short clips you're showing him. Yes?

16 MR. WICK: I am not clear on
17 your question, Mr. Berger. The video is the
18 video.

19 MR. BERGER: Let me be clear
20 so we can avoid some kind of trap later on. If
21 you are planning on using portions of the video
22 that you haven't shown him later on in these
23 proceedings, then it's your obligation to show
24 him the entirety of the video rather than just
25 show clips.

1 Otherwise, we object on foundational
2 grounds to use of anything other than the clips
3 you have shown him to which he has answered.

4 MR. WICK: Fair enough. We'll
5 come back to that.

6 BY MR. WICK:

7 Q. Let's go to entry November 16, 2020,
8 interview from Cairo. What was that event?

9 A. What is the date?

10 Q. November 16, 2020.

11 A. This is a radio interview for media
12 from Cairo. I did it over the phone.

13 Q. And where were you when you gave the
14 interview?

15 A. I don't really know. Sometimes I do
16 these things while I'm in the car.

17 Q. Were you in the United States?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. I would like to back up very quickly
20 to the last event we discussed, the Beit Sahour
21 speech. Was one of your purposes in giving
22 that speech to advocate for the Palestinian
23 cause?

24 A. They approached me and they said
25 that they are an establishment organization,

1 and they want, just to say -- they invited me
2 in my capacity as the Ambassador of the State
3 of Palestine for the United Nations, and I
4 obliged them.

5 Q. And was one of the reasons that you
6 accepted the invitation and spoke to that group
7 to advocate for the Palestinian cause?

8 A. Everything that I do in my capacity
9 for the UN is advocating for the Palestinian
10 cause.

11 Q. There is an entry on November 19,
12 2020 titled Seton Hall University virtual talk.
13 What does that entry signify?

14 A. Yes. What date is that? November.
15 Again, I was invited and it was done virtually
16 through Speche, if I am not mistaken, it might
17 be the political science department or
18 something to do with international law, Seton
19 Hall University.

20 Again, academia and universities are
21 key components of the work of the United
22 Nations. I talk about Model UN on part of it
23 and the other part, what they teach, they
24 teach, you know, concrete issues.

25 I was a teacher and I used to teach

1 issues related to the agenda of the UN, and
2 they wanted to know what we do at the United
3 Nations in trying to find a peaceful solution
4 to this conflict.

5 I obliged them and I spoke on that
6 subject related to my work at the UN.

7 Q. All right. We would like to show
8 you another video which we will mark Exhibit 9,
9 an excerpt from a video.

10 (Deposition Exhibit No. 9 was
11 marked for identification.)

12 (Video playing.)

13 BY MR. WICK:

14 Q. Dr. Mansour, do you recognize that
15 excerpt as an excerpt from a video of the talk
16 described in your November 19, 2020 calendar
17 entry?

18 A. I do.

19 Q. Was that a talk given to university
20 students or college students in the United
21 States?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. And where were you when you gave the
24 talk?

25 A. In my office in the Observer Mission

1 of the State of Palestine, United Nations.

2 Q. And was one of the purposes of
3 accepting that invitation and giving that talk
4 to advocate for the Palestinian cause?

5 A. As I said before, when I am invited
6 in my capacity as the Observer, Ambassador of
7 the State of Palestine for the United Nations,
8 I, you know, speak in that capacity on the
9 advancing the cause of the Palestinians and
10 United Nations.

11 Q. The next entry is November 23, 2020
12 -- not the next entry -- well, it is the next
13 entry. It states, bureau meeting. Do you see
14 that entry?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. Do you know what that means?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. What is the bureau being referred
19 to?

20 A. It is the Bureau of Committee on the
21 Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the
22 Palestinian People, it is a General Assembly
23 committee.

24 Q. Last item on the page, December 10,
25 2020, titled, all I want for Christmas is a

1 stronger multilateral system.

2 Do you know what that event was?

3 A. That was a nice event. There are
4 global Ambassadors, they would discuss -- well,
5 let me, first of all, yes, I know. That is
6 your question.

7 Q. Okay. What was the event?

8 A. As I said, you know, global
9 Ambassadors that, you know, they dialogue and
10 discuss defending multilateralism, which
11 embodiment of that is United Nations, because
12 there was a threat against multilateralism from
13 certain quarters during the few years before
14 that date, threatening multilateralism so that
15 those group of Ambassadors were brainstorming
16 about the ways and means of how to protecting
17 and ending and what it stands for as an example
18 of multilateralism. And since that event was
19 so close to Christmas, then, you know the title
20 of it is All I Want for Christmas is a Stronger
21 Multilateral System.

22 Q. So I'm not clear, what was the
23 event, was it a panel discussion or a speech,
24 for example? What is the event?

25 A. It is a brainstorming on a Zoom

1 session among a number of Ambassadors.

2 Q. Can we go to the next page, please,
3 the one after that. There are two entries
4 midway down the page from March 17, 2021 and
5 then one two lines below it on March 18, 2021
6 titled, Invitation to the Fifth Retreat of the
7 Friends of Monterrey. Do you see that?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. And was that an event that you
10 attended?

11 A. No. I did not attend that.

12 Q. Did anyone attend from the Observer
13 Mission in your place?

14 A. Yes. I asked one of my colleagues
15 to attend.

16 Q. And who attended?

17 A. The person who is in charge of
18 issues related to development.

19 Q. And what is that person's name?

20 A. Abdallah.

21 Q. Is that a first name or a last name?

22 A. Abdallah Abushawesh.

23 Q. Okay. And what is the Friends of
24 Monterrey?

25 A. One of the key issues that was under

1 consideration for a long period of time at the
2 UN is the concept of finance for development.
3 First conference of finance for development
4 took place in Monterrey, Mexico, and every five
5 years, a continuation of the same concepts, the
6 need to organize similar conferences. One, the
7 second one, I believe Dor in Hefa (phonetic),
8 and another one, Addis Ababa in Ethiopia.

9 So the Mexican Ambassador, because
10 this is the beginning of a very key component
11 of the developmental agenda at the United
12 Nations, which it is evaded and discussed
13 heavily in the second committee and also in the
14 SDGs, the sustainable development goals, and
15 they form a Friends of Monterrey to keep the
16 principals of Monterrey on finance for
17 development alive.

18 Before the COVID, they used to
19 invite a number of friends to go and meet in
20 Monterrey, Mexico, over two days, discussing
21 and debating issues related to finance for
22 development.

23 But because of the COVID, this was
24 done virtually. So that's what this is all
25 about. Very, very important pillar of our

1 discussion in the economic and developmental
2 team of the UN is we finance for development
3 and the founding place for this concept was in
4 Monterrey, Mexico.

5 Q. Is the Friends of Monterrey
6 affiliated with the UN?

7 A. Yes. Of course.

8 Q. How so?

9 A. As I said, you know, that if you
10 look at the SDGs 17 Goal and the 169 targets,
11 finance for development is a very important
12 concept for eradication of poverty, for better
13 educational system for humanity, rights of
14 women, climate change and the rest of all of
15 the goals and targets, finance for development
16 is a key component for the implementation of
17 SDGs, which it is the SDGs, and implementing
18 them by 2030 is like, you know, the human
19 rights, you know, elements agenda of human
20 rights.

21 So that is one of the pillars of the
22 thinking of the United Nations in the --

23 Q. Other than the fact that the Friends
24 of Monterrey and the United Nations are both
25 interested in finance for development, is there

1 any affiliation between the two organizations?

2 A. You mean the UN in finance and
3 development?

4 Q. I mean the UN and Friends of
5 Monterrey.

6 A. When the Monterrey conference was
7 convened, it was a line conference.

8 Q. And Abdallah Abushawesh attended
9 virtually?

10 A. I believe so.

11 Q. Do you know where he was when he
12 attended?

13 A. I believe, most likely, in his
14 house.

15 Q. Where is his house?

16 A. Queens.

17 Q. Queens?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. And to be clear, the topic discussed
20 at the fifth Retreat of the Friends of
21 Monterrey were UN topics?

22 A. Absolutely.

23 Q. Next item I would like to ask about
24 is April 6, 2021 Palestinian affairs and the
25 Biden administration, status quo versus

1 political engagement, Dr. Riyad Mansour,
2 Permanent Observer of the State of Palestine to
3 the United Nations.

4 Do you see that?

5 A. I see it.

6 Q. Do you know what that entry is or
7 what it signifies?

8 A. Is this the university -- Biden
9 administration -- if it is a university,
10 Bridgewater University, then this is a lecture
11 -- a discussion at that institution.

12 Q. You believe this is a speech you
13 gave to Bridgewater State University?

14 A. It could be, yes. I don't remember
15 exactly, but I have a feeling that it might be
16 that.

17 Q. Would this be a different speech to
18 Bridgewater State University than the one that
19 we talked about before on your privilege log?

20 A. We did not talk about the
21 Bridgewater University yet.

22 Q. Do you recall, a little while ago
23 when we talked about an entry on your privilege
24 log that referred to Boston College, and you
25 indicated you believe that that actually was a

1 Bridgewater State event?

2 A. I don't know if it was on that day.
3 I remember, for that university, dates changed
4 more than one time, and it could be that
5 function on April 6, not on that date
6 previously.

7 Q. Okay. I would like to show you a
8 video that we would like to have marked as
9 Exhibit 10.

10 (Deposition Exhibit No. 10 was
11 marked for identification.)

12 (Video playing.)

13 BY MR. WICK:

14 Q. Dr. Mansour, do you recognize that
15 as an excerpt from a video of, or a speech to
16 Bridgewater State University as reflected in
17 your calendar entry?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. This is the April 6, 2021 entry that
20 we have been discussing, Palestinian affairs
21 and the Biden administration?

22 A. I believe so.

23 Q. And you were speaking to U.S.
24 college students in that speech; correct?

25 A. And professors.

1 Q. And professors. And where were you
2 when you gave the presentation?

3 A. My office at the Observer Mission of
4 the State of Palestine, United Nations.

5 Q. And was one of the purposes of that
6 speech to advocate for the Palestinian cause?

7 A. Again, as I said, you know,
8 universities are a key component of the
9 decisionmaking process at the United Nations.
10 And universities also have programs, study
11 issues on the agenda of the UN, including the
12 question of Palestine.

13 So when they invite me, they invite
14 me in that capacity, and they ask me questions
15 as it relates to their education, to their
16 students, about how the United Nations is with
17 the Palestine question.

18 Q. And was one of the purposes of that
19 speech to advocate for the Palestinian cause to
20 those students and professors?

21 A. Again, as I said, everything that I
22 do in my capacity as Permanent Observer of the
23 State of Palestine to the United Nations is to
24 advocate for justice for the Palestinians on
25 the basis of the UN charter and UN

1 resolutions --

2 THE COURT REPORTER: I'm
3 sorry, Doctor, you cut out again at the end.

4 THE WITNESS: At the end, I
5 said that on the basis of international law and
6 relevant UN resolutions.

7 BY MR. WICK:

8 Q. On -- the next item I would like to
9 ask about is May, the very bottom, May 6, 2021,
10 informal active dialogues with the candidates.
11 And if we scroll to the next page, you will see
12 an identical entry for May 7, 2021.

13 Do you see those two entries?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. What was that event?

16 A. You know, another aspect of the work
17 of the United Nations. Many countries run for
18 offices. For example, every year we have five
19 countries running for seats in the Security
20 Council. So the candidates, they lobby
21 countries or groups so that they can get their
22 votes and to win a seat in the Security
23 Council.

24 Also, we have elections for judges
25 of international corporate justice. Countries

1 who have candidates, they lobby other countries
2 for their votes. And there are so many
3 elections at the United Nations, for seats in
4 the Social and Economic Councils, for seats in
5 the Human Rights Council.

6 So these candidates and their
7 Ambassadors would lobby others to get their
8 votes. These are meetings related to
9 candidates running for office at the UN. And
10 that is another key component of the work of
11 the United Nations.

12 Q. And so attending those meetings was
13 officially UN business; correct?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And you were attending in your
16 capacity as Permanent Observer; correct?

17 A. Absolutely.

18 Q. And what did you discuss with those
19 candidates?

20 A. Basically, they are lobbying us to
21 get our support, if we can vote, get our vote.
22 If we cannot vote, they know that we are
23 influential at the UN so that we can say good
24 things about them to those who have the
25 capacity to vote.

1 What do I discuss with their
2 members, let's say, who are running for seats
3 in the Security Council? That we are active in
4 the agenda of the Security Council. There is
5 discussions of issues related to us in the
6 Security Council, specifically, so then they
7 have to prove to me that they will be
8 objective, guided by the principles of the
9 charter, UN resolutions, international law,
10 when these issues are discussed in the Security
11 Council in order to get my approval and support
12 for them and their candidature -- in the
13 business of the UN.

14 Q. Did you ask any questions of the
15 candidates?

16 A. Most likely, yes, but I don't
17 recall. It's a general discussion, you know,
18 and these candidates, there are so many of
19 them, covering so many different issues from
20 the Security Council, Human Rights Council, so
21 many other positions.

22 Q. There is an entry on May 19, 2021
23 titled, interview with Morning Joe on MSNBC.
24 You were interviewed that day, you were
25 interviewed live on the Morning Joe program;

1 correct?

2 A. That is correct.

3 Q. As you might guess, we are going to
4 show you an interview, or a video, excuse me,
5 that we would like to mark as Exhibit 11. We
6 will show you an excerpt from the interview.

7 (Deposition Exhibit No. 11 was
8 marked for identification.)

9 (Video playing.)

10 BY MR. WICK:

11 Q. Dr. Mansour, do you recognize that
12 as an excerpt of a -- of your interview with
13 the Morning Joe program notated on your
14 calendar for May 19, 2021?

15 A. I do.

16 Q. And where were you when you gave
17 that interview?

18 A. In my office in the Observer Mission
19 of the State of Palestine to the United
20 Nations.

21 Q. Where you are sitting right now;
22 correct?

23 A. Correct.

24 Q. And you were speaking in that
25 interview to the American public; correct?

1 A. I was speaking to Joe and the lady
2 who is the co-anchor woman and through them, I
3 guess, to their audience.

4 Q. And was one of the purposes of
5 giving that interview to advocate for the
6 Palestinian cause?

7 A. The purpose of -- the main purpose
8 of that speech was to exert all efforts
9 possible to have a cease fire, stop the war
10 that was waging against the Palestinian people
11 in the occupied territory, particularly in the
12 Gaza Strip.

13 And that is -- was a discussion in
14 the Security Council at that time and
15 consultation with all members of the Security
16 Council, all members, including the P-5, in
17 order to bring about a cease fire as soon as
18 possible. That was the main objective of that
19 interview, which is, in my capacity as the
20 Permanent Observer of the State of Palestine to
21 the UN, is to do everything possible within the
22 Security Council, within the United Nations,
23 and the entire international community, to
24 bring a quick cease fire and put an end to that
25 tragedy to save lives.

1 Q. Next, May 22, 2021, there is an
2 entry for Al Jazeera interview. Do you see
3 that?

4 A. May what, 20?

5 Q. May 22, 2021?

6 A. I see it.

7 Q. Does that entry reflect you were
8 interviewed by Al Jazeera on that date?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. I want to show you a video marked as
11 Exhibit 12.

12 (Deposition Exhibit No. 12 was
13 marked for identification.)

14 BY MR. WICK:

15 Q. Do you recognize Exhibit 12 as an
16 excerpt from a video of your interview with Al
17 Jazeera that's reflected in your calendar on
18 May 22, 2021?

19 A. That is correct.

20 Q. And where were you when you gave
21 that interview?

22 A. My office. In --

23 Q. In the Observer Mission?

24 A. Observer Mission of the State of
25 Palestine to the United Nations.

1 Q. Where you're sitting right now;
2 correct?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. And was one of the purposes of
5 giving that interview to advocate for the
6 Palestinian cause?

7 A. The main purpose of that interview
8 is to show what was happening in the Security
9 Council in our efforts to have a cease fire,
10 immediate cease fire to the battle that was
11 waging at that time and to save lives of
12 civilians, particularly children in which 66 of
13 them were killed in the Gaza Strip during that
14 aggression.

15 Q. Then on May 25, 2021, there is an
16 entry, virtual farewell meeting with ICC
17 prosecutor.

18 Do you see that?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. What was that event?

21 A. We are -- it is an event to say
22 goodbye to Madam Bensouda, who is the
23 prosecutor of the ICC, she finished and, you
24 know, members of the ICC and we are a state
25 party member and, in fact, we sit on the Bureau

1 of the ICC, to say goodbye to her and to thank
2 her for her work during that tenure.

3 Q. And was that meeting virtual, as the
4 entry suggests?

5 A. It was virtual.

6 Q. Where were you when you attended the
7 meeting?

8 A. I did not attend that meeting.

9 Q. Oh. Why is it on your calendar?

10 A. Because I was supposed to attend but
11 something came up. I sent one of my colleagues
12 to attend on my behalf.

13 Q. Who attended on your behalf?

14 A. Majed Bamyia.

15 Q. Did Mr. Bamyia speak at the event?

16 A. I don't really know.

17 Q. And what was the purpose of sending
18 somebody from the Observer Mission to attend?

19 A. Because he is the specialist that
20 handles, you know, legal issues including the
21 ICC.

22 Q. Why did you think it was appropriate
23 to have somebody from the Observer Mission
24 represent the State of Palestine at this event
25 as opposed to someone in Ramallah?

1 A. The ICC has different components to
2 its structure, including the General Assembly
3 of the ICC, which is composed of close to 128
4 countries. We are one of them. We are a full
5 member, a state party in the ICC.

6 The way they operate is they
7 alternate between New York or the Hague. And
8 most of the time in New York, because all of
9 the countries that are members of the ICC have
10 Ambassadors representing them here in -- and
11 when they need to elect the bureau, they do it
12 most of the times in New York, this is when we
13 were connected for the last two times
14 successively as a member of the bureau. It
15 doesn't happen in capitals. As I said, it
16 happens in New York or in the Hague because the
17 headquarter of the ICC is in the Hague,
18 Netherlands.

19 Q. So the reason for having somebody
20 from the Observer Mission attend was because it
21 would be more convenient to have somebody based
22 in New York to attend than somebody in
23 Ramallah?

24 A. And the person, my colleague is a
25 specialist from our side, on the ICC affairs,

1 so he would be -- if I do not go to attend, he
2 would be the appropriate person to go and
3 represent me, because he is very familiar with
4 the issues and the discussions including even
5 saying goodbye to the prosecutor.

6 Q. The reason for having somebody from
7 the Observer Mission attend this rather than
8 have somebody from Ramallah attend would be
9 because the Observer Mission is in New York and
10 the events are frequently in New York?

11 MR. BERGER: Objection. That
12 misstates his testimony. It's asked and
13 answered. I know you don't seem to like his
14 answer, but you have asked that question three
15 times.

16 MR. WICK: I'm afraid I don't
17 understand the answer. It's not about liking
18 or not liking. So I will not misstate his
19 testimony. I will ask the question again.

20 BY MR. WICK:

21 Q. What is the purpose of having
22 somebody from the Observer Mission attend this
23 event as opposed to somebody from Ramallah?

24 A. It is not that we are doing
25 something different than other countries do.

1 All other members of the ICC, they have their
2 Ambassadors at the -- or whomever the
3 Ambassador designates, from his Mission, attend
4 these meetings in New York.

5 So we do like everybody -- others
6 do. It is not the representative from the
7 capital that attend these meetings when they
8 take place in New York. It is the Ambassadors
9 in New York attend. When it happens in the
10 Hague, the Ambassador in the Hague attend.

11 If there is a conference at the
12 ministerial level for the ICC, then the
13 minister attends regardless of the location of
14 where the meeting takes place. This is how
15 this business is done.

16 Q. And is attending a farewell meeting
17 with the ICC prosecutor officially UN business
18 in your view?

19 A. Yes, it is.

20 Q. To the best of your recollection, on
21 this calendar today, are there any entries
22 concerning public activities, other than those
23 activities involving official UN business
24 undertaken on behalf of the Observer Mission
25 that are missing from this list?

1 A. To the best of my ability, there is
2 nothing missing from this list.

3 MR. WICK: I think we are -- I
4 think this is probably a good time for a lunch
5 break, but before we set that in motion, can we
6 just go off the record for a moment?

7 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are now
8 off the record. The time is 1637 UTC time.

9 (Discussion held off the
10 record.)

11 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are
12 back on the record. The time is 1640 UTC time.

13 MR. WICK: I think this is a
14 good time to break for lunch, and I guess I
15 would ask others involved, what do we need in
16 terms of time, given that we're virtual; is 45
17 minutes enough?

18 MR. BERGER: How long do you
19 anticipate you have for your remaining
20 questioning?

21 MR. WICK: Quite a bit.
22 Several hours.

23 MR. BERGER: Well, why don't
24 we take a full hour.

25 MR. WICK: Okay. Come back at

1 1:40?

2 MR. BERGER: Very good.

3 Thanks.

4 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are now
5 off the record. The time is 1641 UTC time.

6 (At 12:41 p.m., a lunch recess
7 was taken.)

8 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are
9 back on the record. The time is 1743 UTC time.

10 BY MR. WICK:

11 Q. Good afternoon, Dr. Mansour. I want
12 to go back to the Observer Mission building.
13 You indicated the Observer Mission owns that
14 building. To be clear, the Observer Mission
15 has owned that building at all times since
16 January 4, 2020; is that correct?

17 A. I am sorry, can you repeat the
18 question, please?

19 Q. Yes. The question is, has the
20 Observer Mission owned the Observer Mission
21 building at all times since January 4th of
22 2020?

23 A. That is correct.

24 Q. I'm going to return to Exhibit 2
25 from very early in the deposition. As I

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1 engaged in any activity intended to raise money
2 for the State of Palestine?

3 A. No.

4 Q. Are you aware of any fundraising
5 events that have taken place, after January 4th
6 of 2020, that were conducted on behalf of the
7 PLO or the PA?

8 A. I am not aware.

9 Q. Are you aware of any fundraising
10 events that have taken place after January 4th
11 of 2020 that were conducted on behalf of the
12 Observer Mission?

13 A. I am not aware.

14 Q. Are you aware of any fundraising
15 events that have taken place after January 4,
16 2020 that were conducted on behalf of the State
17 of Palestine?

18 MR. BERGER: I assume you mean
19 in the United States?

20 MR. WICK: Yes, thank you for
21 that clarification, Mr. Berger, in the United
22 States.

23 THE WITNESS: No.

24 BY MR. WICK:

25 Q. At any time after January 4th of

1 2020, has the Observer Mission provided members
2 of the Palestinian community in the United
3 States with assistance in getting documents
4 authenticated or notarized?

5 A. Can you repeat the last part of it?

6 Q. I will repeat the whole question to
7 be clear.

8 A. Okay.

9 Q. At any time after January 4th of
10 2020, has the Observer Mission provided members
11 of the Palestinian community in the United
12 States with assistance in getting documents
13 authenticated or notarized?

14 A. No.

15 Q. To your knowledge, has the PLO or
16 the PA or the State of Palestine provided such
17 assistance during that time period?

18 A. No.

19 Q. At any time after January 4th of
20 2020, has the Observer Mission maintained a
21 list of notaries that it recommends to
22 Palestinian-Americans?

23 A. No.

24 Q. To your knowledge, has the PLO
25 maintained such a list?

1 A. No.

2 Q. And to your knowledge, has the PA
3 maintained such a list?

4 A. I don't know.

5 Q. To your knowledge, has the State of
6 Palestine maintained such a list?

7 A. As far as I know, no.

8 Q. Are you familiar with the term
9 consular services?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. What is your understanding of what
12 consular services are?

13 A. Consular services means with the
14 passport and certification of documents for
15 companies, individuals, and a host of things
16 known as consular services outside the
17 representation, like in our case, the UN or if
18 you have a bilateral relationship
19 representation to the country where you
20 represent --

21 Q. At any time after January 4th of
22 2020, has the Observer Mission provided
23 consular services in the United States?

24 A. No.

25 Q. To your knowledge, any time after

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1 is --

2 THE COURT REPORTER: I'm
3 sorry, Doctor, the what committee?

4 THE WITNESS: The first, the
5 No. 1 committee, which is the disarmament
6 committee, and he is active in the Security
7 Council affairs as part of our team.

8 He is also our lead representative
9 in all issues related to the ICC, in New York.
10 And he also has other responsibilities that I
11 designate.

12 BY MR. WICK:

13 Q. Does he have an office in the
14 Observer Mission building?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. Next is Mr. Abou Shawesh. You
17 mentioned him a little bit earlier. What does
18 he do?

19 A. Abdallah Abou Shawesh is our lead
20 representative in the Second Committee. It is
21 one of the extremely busy committees at the
22 United Nations responsible for producing at
23 least 40 resolutions annually related to
24 economic development.

25 Remember, I referred to Friends of

1 Monterrey is one component. It deals with all
2 of the details of the SDGs, the sustainable
3 development goals and targets, and he is
4 also -- represent us on the Social and Economic
5 Council, on the economic part of the Social and
6 Economic Council, and as a -- I forgot to say
7 that, in the Second Committee, Third Committee
8 and Fourth Committee, and now in this case of
9 Abdallah, there are resolutions specific to the
10 question of Palestine, at least one resolution
11 in the case of Fedra. In the Fourth Committee
12 there are eight or seven resolutions adopted
13 annually or biannually, and they are
14 responsible for negotiating and, you know,
15 operating these draft resolutions and
16 collecting sponsorships to put them to a vote.

17 Q. Next on the list is Sahar Abu
18 Shawesh?

19 A. Sahar Abu Shawesh is a key player
20 with Abdallah in the Second Committee division
21 of labor as to the term, all of that committee,
22 so she covers a number of these issues. One
23 example is realignment, the sub item that they
24 deal with in the Second Committee.

25 So she is extremely helpful and

1 often she leads a group of Ambassadors, on
2 behalf of the Group of 77 and China, to
3 negotiate with other group, the substance of a
4 resolution here and resolution there.

5 Q. And does she have an office in the
6 Observer Mission building?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. And I neglected to ask, Abdallah
9 Abou Shawesh, does he have an office in the
10 Observer Mission building as well?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. What about Nada Tarbush, I believe
13 you mentioned that she has left. What did she
14 do?

15 A. She followed mainly the Fifth
16 Committee because the Fifth Committee, during
17 our chairmanship of the Group of 77 and China
18 is extremely active committee, it deals with
19 the budget of the UN and the allocations of
20 money to different items, different committees
21 and resolutions that have financial
22 implications, and she used to help, you know,
23 with some issues related to the First Committee
24 and some issues and activities related to the
25 work of Fedá.

1 Q. Okay. And did she have an office in
2 the Observer Mission building?

3 A. When she was with us, she had an
4 office.

5 Q. And next is Sahar Khalil Salem, what
6 did he or she do?

7 A. She has responsibilities with some
8 experts in the Security Council because the way
9 the Security Council operates, you have
10 Ambassadors, you have the deputy Ambassadors,
11 you have the experts. Usually the experts,
12 they do a lot of the legwork in terms of
13 details of draft resolutions. They keep
14 sharing with each other details and information
15 of the files that they follow, in our case,
16 files related to the question of Palestine,
17 they cover so many areas, and she is active
18 with her colleagues, the experts.

19 In addition to that, she is taking
20 now larger responsibility in the Third
21 Committee after the departure of Nadya Rasheed.
22 She is mainly specialist on issues related to
23 children and children in conflict and she is,
24 you know, the liaison between me and the
25 special representative of the Security General

1 on children in armed conflict, and she also
2 represents us on the item -- questions or
3 issues of information in the Fourth Committee,
4 and other responsibilities that I ask of her.

5 Q. I'm sorry, I think I asked that
6 question in the past tense. Ms. Salem still
7 works for the Observer Mission; correct?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. And she has an office in the
10 Observer Mission building?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. The next is Nadia Ghannam, who we
13 talked about with respect to social media.

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. What else did she do?

16 A. She is our representative in a group
17 of Asia-Pacific grouping in the United Nations.
18 This group of countries is very important group
19 that deals with nominations of countries for
20 different posts and positions.

21 For example, when we ran to be the
22 chair of the Group 77 and China, we had to
23 submit our, you know, nomination to that group,
24 and we had to lobby in order to get a unanimous
25 endorsement of that group to be the candidate

1 to assume that post on behalf of that group
2 before it went to the Group of 77 and China for
3 endorsement and announcement in the General
4 Assembly, that the State of Palestine was, in
5 the year 2009, chair of the Group of 77 and
6 China, and she does other responsibilities I
7 ask her.

8 She has an office in the Mission.

9 Q. Okay. And next is Ghada Hassan
10 Abdelwahab. What does that individual do?

11 A. She is, you know, a financial
12 officer. She is responsible for, you know, the
13 payroll, the payment of all the bills around
14 our building, the automobile, the telephone
15 bills, everything of that nature, and the
16 preparing the regular reports to the finance
17 department.

18 And she is also our liaison officer
19 when the President or ministers come, usually
20 officers from the State Department contact us
21 through her about all the regulations that they
22 want from us about the arrival of dignitaries
23 and their safety and security.

24 Q. Okay. I believe that you told us
25 earlier that Mr. Alhantouli and Ms. Barghouti

English Language Remarks of Riyad Mansour

(1:59:56 – 2:07:45)

Let me now shift to say a few words in English.

I know that a significant portion of your community are young. I wrote a book in the late 70s about the Palestinian American community and how it organizes itself. I can say now that we have hundreds of thousands of Palestinian Americans in the United States of America. And I can say further that more than 90 [percent] of them have been born in the United States.

There is a significant number from within our community who are teenagers or younger, who are attending high school or attending colleges and universities.

I know that in American universities there are a very active group of organizations and there is a strong trend on campuses for movements and organizations and solidarity committees working for supporting justice for the Palestinian people.

I think that the young Palestinian Americans are exactly like anyone else. Like the Italian Americans, like the Latino Americans, like the Afro Americans, like all the other minority groups of Americans.

They are very active in so many important issues to the youth and to their communities. Among these issues is supporting justice for the Palestinian people and lobbying the government, lobbying Congress, in order really to take more of a balanced and just position, to acknowledge and recognize that the Palestinian people should be granted the right to self determination and independence in their own state and the right to [unintelligible].

So then I call upon the young men and women of your community, especially those who are attending university, to be given all the support that they should be given and to recognize their activism and their role in supporting the just cause of the Palestinians. And we urge them to become even more active, especially in light of the arrival of a new administration in Washington, D.C., of President-elect Biden. I think that, we hope, that this new administration will move in the direction of fairness and justice for the Palestinian people and not to be like the previous administration, the administration of President Trump, that was siding with the Israeli side, having adopted their position fully.

I believe that you have opportunities in this very important country to play a bigger role in supporting your families in Beit Sahour, Palestine, who are steadfastly [unintelligible] in the occupied land of the State of Palestine. They are defending our towns and cities in the occupied land of the State of Palestine. They are defending our holy places for Christians and Muslims whether in Bethlehem or Jerusalem. And you have a big responsibility being put on your shoulders to play an active role in this endeavor.

The first step you have taken by organizing yourselves. The second step is empowering your youth and those who are active among you with the system that you live in as Palestinian Americans.

You are not foreigners in this country since you are citizens of the United States of America. And don't act like foreigners. You should act like everyone in this society because everyone in America came from somewhere. Your neighbors they might be Italian Americans, Greek Americans, Irish Americans. In your case you are Palestinian Americans.

And in order to be effective in this society, you are not a foreigner, you are exactly like everybody else. And you are so proud of the fact that your parents, or your grandparents, came from Palestine. You remember them with affection. And you are committed for helping your people for justice for the Palestinian people and for the State of Palestine. This is normal in the United States, and I am sure that you know that, and I advise you to act on such basis because if you act this way you will be extremely effective and therefore very helpful in advancing the cause of the Palestinian people, for justice, independence, and self-determination.

Again, I want to congratulate you for forming your own organization. I congratulate you for convening the first national convention. And I want to congratulate the executive committee that will be elected, or the board, at the end of your convention. And I will be delighted to always communicate with your organization if there is anything that I can do, or our mission to the United Nations can do, representing the State of Palestine at the United Nations, and we are in New York, we will be more than happy to do so. We are all together brothers and sisters, sons and daughters of the great nation of Palestine.

Thank you very much. I wish you the best, and Mabrouk [congratulations] for your very wonderful convention that you are convening in this manner through zoom and I hope in the future you will convene it in a place where hundreds of us will be together, where our women will be wearing our wonderful robes and dresses, and we can all of us sing and do the Dabke and do the things that we learned to how do over hundreds of years as proud Palestinians and as proud people from Beit Sahour. Thank you very much and all the best.


