Dear Mr. Harris:

We write on behalf of respondents Schools, Health & Libraries Broadband Coalition; Competitive Carriers Association; National Telecommunications Cooperative Association dba NTCA; USTelecom – The Broadband Association; Benton Institute for Broadband & Society; National Digital Inclusion Alliance; and Center for Media Justice dba MediaJustice (together, “Intervenor Respondents”) in the above-captioned case.

We write to notify the Court that Intervenor Respondents maintain our interest in the outcome of the government’s petition and support granting the petition for the reasons stated therein. Should the Court grant the government’s petition, Intervenor Respondents intend to seek all available relief. *See* S. Ct. R. 12.6 (“All parties to the proceeding in the court whose judgment is sought to be reviewed are deemed parties in this Court”); *Black v. United States*, 561 U.S. 465, 468 n.1 (2010) (respondent filing a letter in support of a petitioner “qualifies for relief under this Court’s Rule 12.6”). We also have interests that are distinct from those of the government. Accordingly, we have filed our own petition for a writ of certiorari, docketed in Case No. 24-422, and we request that the Court grant our petition alongside the government’s petition.
