MOTION FOR LEAVE TO DISPENSE WITH PREPARATION OF A JOINT APPENDIX

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 26.8, Petitioner respectfully moves for leave to dispense with the requirement of a joint appendix. Respondent agrees that a joint appendix is not necessary.
