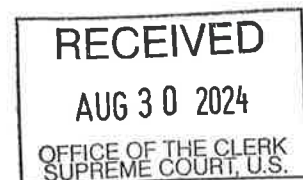

Dear Clerk:

I am requesting pursuant to Rule 30 that the time to file my petition for certiorari be extended from September ~~20~~<sup>1st</sup>, 2024 by 60 days to and including ~~November 20~~<sup>October 31st</sup>, 2024. No prior extensions have been granted or denied. I require additional time to file my petition because of being incarcerated and recently injured while incarcerated after a slip and fall. My accident and time to heal in addition to other time commitments caused by the bankruptcy court have caused delay in putting my brief together. Furthermore, the Santa Ana Jail where I am housed has gone through changes to its operations and has limited my time in the law library depriving me of the time I require to research and prepare my brief. I require additional time to research case law regarding contempt. The jail's module is limited to one (1) computer but I am segregated and only allowed out of my cell four (4) hours per week compared to the others who are allowed out 70 hours per week. I continue to request additional time and have been denied said requests. I have been diligently trying to work on my petition and require an additional 60 days. This petition deals with civil contempt which is in dispute and was purged and my appeal was dismissed as moot even though I disputed the validity of the underlying order which was also appealed and dismissed as moot.



The civil contempt order was used to deny my discharge in bankruptcy denying me of my fresh start. Opposing party will not be prejudiced by this extension request. This request is made in good faith and not to delay resolution of this matter which is very important and should not evade review because I should not have been held in contempt or denied a discharge.
