Dear Justice Kagan:

I am counsel of record for respondents in the above-referenced case, and have received the application of petitioners Uber Technologies, Inc, and Raiser, LLC for an extension of 58 days in which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari. Although counsel for respondents generally does not oppose requests for extensions of time, we must oppose the lengthy extension requested in this case. The decision that petitioners would ask the Court to review was issued on August 30, 2024; petitioners are effectively seeking nearly six months in which to prepare and file their petition for certiorari. The law firm Perkins Coie LLP, which is counsel for petitioners in this Court, represented petitioners on appeal and in the district court, and its members are intimately familiar with the legal issues petitioners promise to raise in their petition. Under these circumstances, the nearly two-month extension sought by petitioners seems excessive. Respondents therefore urge the Court to deny the extension; alternatively, we ask the Court to grant a shorter, more reasonable and appropriate extension in which to file their petition.
