The petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-captioned case was originally filed August 18<sup>th</sup> 2024 and docketed January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2025 after several corrections recommended by the Clerk. On February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2025 the petition of writ of certiorari was distributed for conference along with a motion to proceed in forma pauperis. On February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2025 a order was issued, the motion of petitioner for leave to proceed in forma pauperis is denied. Petitioner is allowed until March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025, within which to pay the docketing fee required by Rule 38(a) and to submit a petition in compliance with Rule 33.1 of the Rules of this Court. The petitioner respectfully requests under Rule 30.2 of the Rules of this Court, a further extension of time of at least 30 days, preferably 60 days from March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025 until May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

This extension is necessary because pro se is a full time over the road semi truck driver, in many instances working away from home for several days to several weeks at a time. Pro se petitioner with the principal responsibility for preparation of the petition of the writ will be heavily engaged in work and personal related responsibilities. At the beginning of this case the petitioner was engaged in social work and then local construction work and had more time, after conviction and a weakening economy the petitioner had to change careers. Over the road trucking is time consuming, strenuous, and in many cases hard to have internet access and ECENED

time to prepare. The petitioner will need approximately 30 days to properly edit the petition in compliance with Rule 33.1.
