
# PETITIONER'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE A PETITION FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI

TO THE HONORABLE CHIEF JUSTICE AND ASSOCIATE JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES:

COMES NOW, Petitioner Paul K. Lacombe, proceeding pro se, respectfully moves this Court pursuant to Rule 13.5 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States, for an extension of time of sixty (60) days to file a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari to review the judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit in Paul Lacombe v. Warden James T. Vaughn Correctional Center, et al., No. 24-2961. In support thereof, Petitioner states as follows:

# 1. Judgment Below

On February 21, 2025, the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit denied Petitioner's request for a Certificate of Appealability (COA) in the above-captioned case. The judgment of the Third Circuit is now final.



### 2. Time for Filing a Petition for Certiorari

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13.1, a petition for a writ of certiorari must be filed within ninety (90) days after entry of the judgment below. Accordingly, the deadline for filing the petition is May 22, 2025.

#### 3. Grounds for Extension

Petitioner respectfully requests an extension of time of sixty (60) additional days, up to and including **July 21, 2025**, to file his petition for a writ of certiorari. This extension is necessary for the following reasons:

a. <u>Limited access to legal materials and resources.</u>

As an incarcerated individual, Petitioner faces constraints in accessing legal materials, research tools, and necessary assistance to prepare an adequate and well-reasoned petition.

- b. Need for sufficient time to research and draft the petition.
  - Given the complexity of the legal issues involved in his habeas corpus petition, Petitioner requires additional time to present his arguments effectively before this Honorable Court.
- c. Procedural and logistical delays.
- d. The prison law library's restricted hours, combined with the delays associated with mailing legal documents from correctional facilities, present additional challenges that warrant an extension.

## 4. Conclusion

For the foregoing reasons, Petitioner respectfully requests that this Court grant an extension of sixty (60) days, up to and including July 21, 2025, to file his *Petition for a Writ of Certiorari*.
