RULE 29.6 STATEMENTS

Petitioners' Statements pursuant to Rule 29.6 were set forth at pages iii-iv of the petition for a writ of certiorari, and there are no amendments to those Statements. On January 15, 2025, New York began enforcing its broadband rate-regulation law for the first time since New York enacted it in 2021.¹ As we noted in our petition for rehearing (at 5 n.7), that event created a "serious risk that . . . some providers will cease offering broadband service in New York rather than sell at a loss." That risk has come to pass. AT&T has withdrawn its 5G fixed wireless home internet offering — AT&T Internet Air — from New York because of the rate-regulation law.² AT&T had offered service in Albany, Binghamton, Buffalo, Elmira, New York City, Plattsburgh, Rochester, Syracuse, Utica, and Watertown.³ AT&T currently offers Internet Air in cities in 47 other States and in the District of Columbia,⁴ which do not regulate broadband rates.

CONCLUSION

The petition for rehearing should be granted.
